

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## Residential Recycling

### Curbside Single-Stream Recycling

(Place the following empty and clean items in your recycling cart with the yellow lid) for weekly collection:



- **Plastics** – rinsed #1 through #7, no polystyrene foam.
- **Glass** – rinsed clear, brown and green bottles and jars; lids removed
- **Metals** – rinsed aluminum, tin and steel cans, aluminum foil and pastry tins, and household metals, pots and pans
- **Paper** – office and school paper, newsprint, junk mail, paper bags, phone books, junk mail, magazines, envelopes, etc.
- **Cardboard** – shoe, gift, and cereal boxes, corrugated boxes, cut or flattened as needed
- **Food and beverage cartons** – milk, cream, egg substitutes, orange juice, soup, broth, and wine cartons, and juice boxes



### Drop-off Recycling Center

Located at 3600 Hartley Avenue

Hours of Operation are Monday, Wednesday,

Friday: Noon-4:00 p.m.; Saturday:10:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.;

Sunday: Noon-4:00 p.m.

Accepts all recyclables listed with no presorting required:

- **Plastics** – rinsed #1 through #7, no polystyrene foam.
- **Glass** – rinsed clear, brown and green bottles and jars; lids removed
- **Metals** – rinsed aluminum, tin and steel cans, aluminum foil and pastry tins, and household metals, pots and pans
- **Paper** – office and school paper, newsprint, junk mail, paper bags, phone books, junk mail, magazines, envelopes, etc.
- **Cardboard** – shoe, gift, and cereal boxes, corrugated boxes, cut or flattened as needed
- **Food and beverage cartons** – milk, cream, egg substitutes, orange juice, soup, broth, and wine cartons, and juice boxes

The following items are sorted in separate containers at this facility:

- Cardboard – large boxes or amounts, no need to breakdown or flatten
- Scrap metal
- Small bundles of yard waste, no larger than 1' high by 3' long and not exceeding 40 lbs. (maximum of 4 bundles per vehicle)

### Upcoming Special Curbside Collections

This special collection will be on your regularly scheduled collection day.

#### **YARD WASTE COLLECTION: Week of November 3**

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (*leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, garden clippings*) will be collected curbside. Place your yard waste in any open top container (*your old green, round recycling container or a clean trash container, NOT YOUR AUTOMATED TOTER*), tie with cotton or hemp twine in bundles no larger than 3' x 3' x 3', and weighing no more than 40lbs, or place in compostable paper bags (*NO PLASTIC BAGS, ROPE OR TWINE*). No grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, any wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter; human or animal excrement; noxious weeds or soil contaminated with hazardous substances.

#### **WHITE GOODS COLLECTION: Week of October 6**

Appliances such as refrigerators and freezers (*remove doors*), washers, dryers, hot water heaters, dehumidifiers, and air conditioners. **ALL FREON MUST BE REMOVED PROFESSIONALLY AND TAGGED PRIOR TO DISPOSAL.**

#### **BULK ITEM COLLECTION: Weeks of September 8 & December 8**

Each residence is allowed to put out one (1) bulk item during each of these collection weeks, on their regularly scheduled collection day. Bulk items are defined as items too



large to fit into the waste toter; and the general rule of thumb is an item the approximate dimensions and weight of a standard size sofa that can be carried by two (2) men. Acceptable items include furniture, mattresses, grills, bicycles, lawnmowers, rolled up and tied rugs no larger than 3' x 6'. Unacceptable materials that will not be collected include construction materials, hazardous waste, tires, yard waste, grass clippings, or additional household trash.

If your bulk items are in good condition, consider donating them to non-profits such as the Salvation Army, American Family Services, ReStore, Habitat for Humanity, or local rummage sales. If you can't wait for a bulk item collection, you may request a special bulk item pickup by contacting Waste Management Customer Service at 800-621-2100. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township, PA to receive the Township's \$25 per item pickup price.

## Businesses Must Recycle Too!

Recycling is the law - required by both the State of Pennsylvania and Palmer Township.

### The Recycling Requirements:

Commercial, institutional, and municipal establishments located in Pennsylvania's mandated municipalities must recycle office paper, corrugated paper and cardboard, newsprint, plastics, steel, aluminum, and bimetallic cans, glass, and leaf waste depending on the items your business generates.

### Recycling Reporting and Documentation must be provided to Palmer Township Annually

The State also requires that all businesses provide written documentation as to the type and weight of materials recycled annually. Reports are due to Palmer Township by January 30 of each year on a form provided by the Township.

### Palmer's Recycling Center Makes it Easy for Businesses!

Located at 3600 Hartley Avenue, Palmer's Recycling Center was created for the purpose of providing a cost effective and easy way for our small businesses to comply with PA Act 101. Drop off all your recyclables free of charge. Be sure to sign in your business with the attendant at the center and you won't need to keep track of your recycling weight for yearly reporting – we'll do it for you!

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## Bike – Hike – Trail Courtesy

To further enhance the enjoyment of living in such a wonderful community as Palmer Township, when using the Delaware & Lehigh Canal Trail as well as any other multi-purpose trails within Palmer Township, as a courtesy to others using the trail, please walk and jog on the right side of the trail in the direction you are headed. Bikers please remember to announce which side of the walker, jogger you intend to pass on. With the ambient noises associated with adjacent roadways, rail lines, waterways, etc., calling out your intention to pass is usually the only notice that the walker or jogger has that you are there!

All users of the Township's trails should "Leave no trace" of their presence. In other words, whatever you bring with you, take with you and do not leave any cans, bottles, wrappers, dog droppings, etc. behind to destroy the natural beauty of the trails that are there for everyone to share!



When you pick up after your dog, please place the bag and its contents in a trash barrels located along the path, or in the trash can at home.



## The Great American Clean-up

On May 10, many local residents took part in this year's Great American Clean-Up by removing four truck loads of debris from the environment...twenty-one bags of recyclables (taken to Hartley Avenue Recycling Center), sixty-five tires (taken by Earth First Co.), seventeen bags of garbage. 



**Palmer Township Beautification Project**

How can the glimpse of some calla lily plants cause such excitement? Walking along my home garden on June 3, I saw the plant shown in the picture. May not seem like a big deal, but it was for me. The history that I know for calla lilies at Palmer's latitude is most die if left in the ground over the winter. Last November I dug up all of the calla lilies that had lived for three consecutive years in my garden. I just had a hunch that it would be a good thing to do. Play it safe and put them in my basement for the winter of 2014. Little did we know that we'd have so much snow this past winter. Most of my butterfly bushes died back to the ground, and the canes from 2013 had to be cut off completely. The June 3 experience was surprising because I apparently did not dig up these calla lily bulbs. They lived through the winter. The data looks pretty convincing that these plants can live through the winter without being taken inside. The other exciting thing is that all the seed pods were saved from the 2013 plants, and the seeds have been planted in my nursery. Each seed pod has between 50 and 90 seeds. May 16, 2014, was the day we transplanted these bulbs to the gardens at Fairview Park and the Post Office to add another visual delight. These lilies produce a white flower.
