




Palmer Township Comprehensive Plan COMMUNITY SURVEY RESULT SUMMARY (AS OF 12/16/16) TOTAL SURVEY RESPONDENTS: 703

QUESTION 1: In general, how satisfied are you with Palmer Township as a place to live?

8 out of 10 respondents expressed they were satisfied or very satisfied. 1 out of 10 respondents expressed they were neutral in satisfaction.

QUESTION 2: Rank the TOP 3 reasons why you selected Palmer Township as your place of residence.

Respondents answered that their top three reasons for living in Palmer Township were due to: 1) Close proximity to family (21.1%), 2) Close proximity to work (18.5), and 3) Quality of available housing (18.3%).

QUESTION 3: Township revenue (primarily from real estate, earned income and business privilege taxes) is used to support the services listed below. The predominant levels of satisfaction that respondents expressed are:

Satisfied: Public Works, Public Safety, General Government Administration, Parks, Recreation and Leisure Services

Neutral: Charles Chrin Community Center, Swimming Pool, Planning and Development.

QUESTION 4: How often do you/others in your household utilize the sidewalks/trails found in the Township?

The majority of respondents indicated that they utilize the sidewalks/trails found in the Township about "ONE to THREE times a MONTH" (23.6%), followed closely by "at least THREE times a WEEK" (22.8%).

QUESTION 5: Please rank the following Township destinations in order of importance to your household for pedestrian access.

Respondents conveyed that the most important destinations to have pedestrian access to are: 1) Parks and Recreation Facilities (21.4%), Shopping Areas (19.6%), Trails (16.4%), and Schools (13.2%).

QUESTION 6: How would you prefer to receive information about Township-related activities, alerts and/or events?

Respondents indicated that the most preferred way to received information about Townshiprelated activities, alerts and/or events would be through the Township Newsletter (25.9%), Facebook (23.4%), Township Website (21.4%), and Township e-blast/real-time digital messages (21.2%).

QUESTION 7: What does your household perceive as major transportation issues within Palmer Township?

Respondents identified that major transportation issues within the Township are perceived to be excessive back-ups at signals (19.7%) and cut-through traffic and/or high speeds on residential streets (19.2%).

QUESTION 8: How well do the housing options in Palmer Township meet your household needs?

In terms of the Variety of Housing in Palmer, the majority of respondents said that it meets the needs of today (94.2%) and they anticipate that the variety will still meet the Township's needs in 5-10 years (62.1%).

In terms of the Affordability of Housing in Palmer, the majority of respondents said that it meets the needs of today (84.8%) and anticipate that the variety will still meet the Township's needs in 5-10 years (55.1%).

QUESTION 9: Please indicate in which area you live.

The overall the mix of respondents were relatively equal.

QUESTION 10: How long have you lived in Palmer Township?

Most of the respondents have lived in the Township for one to 10 years (35.7%), and the second highest portion of respondents have lived in the Township for 11-20 years (29.8%).



Residential Curbside Single-Stream Recycling

Place the following empty and clean items in your recycling cart (with the yellow lid) for weekly collection:

- **Plastics** rinsed bottles, jars, tubs, and rigid containers #1 through #7, discard lids, no polystyrene foam
- **Glass** rinsed clear, brown and green bottles and jars; discard lids
- **Metals** rinsed aluminum, tin and bi-metal cans, aluminum foil and pastry tins, and household metals, pots and pans
- **Paper** white or colored paper, shredded paper, newsprint, paper bags, phone books, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, file folders, envelopes, etc.
- **Cardboard** shoe, gift, and cereal boxes (remove liners), corrugated shipping boxes No need to tie or bundle; cut and/or flatten as needed so as to release easily when the can is emptied
- Food and beverage cartons juice boxes, milk, cream, egg substitutes, orange juice, soup, broth, and wine cartons

The US Fire Administration says most smoke detectors installed today have a life span of 8-10 years, after which the entire

If your detector has been protecting your home for some time now, check the date on the back of the detector, it may be time to start thinking of replacing it. We encourage homeowners to take your existing detector to your local hardware store to assist you in finding a replacement.





On September 28, 2016, the BIP membership held its fourth general membership luncheon of the year. Jeffrey Scheck, Client Development Representative for the Center for Business and Industry of the Northampton Community College was the group's guest speaker. Jeffrey spoke about the decades of business and industry experience their office has to offer businesses within our community. He noted they have an experienced team available to design and deliver specialized training and strategic solutions that can improve any businesses performance, productivity and profits. Jeffrey encouraged the membership to contact the Center for Business and Industry to inquire about any business training requirements they may be facing.

The BIP celebrated their 40th Anniversary on Friday, November 4, 2016, at the Seipsville Hotel. Eighty three members and friends attended and enjoyed a night of recognition and entertainment. The evening included recognition of past award recipients that were in attendance, along with a historical video presentation, created by Robert Lammi, that outlined the history of the organization. The group also presented their Lifetime Achievement Award to Charles Roseberry in recognition of his continuous service to the group over the past 40 years.

The BIP was formed on March 17, 1976, when thirty three business leaders held their first meeting at the Chesterfield Manor. In 1977, the Palmer Township Board of Supervisors voted to join the BIP, which formed the Business/Governmental partnership that exists today. The largest project, to date, that the group took on was the building of the Palmer Branch of the Easton Area Public Library. The group raised \$300,000 and received \$280,000 in grant funding for the Library project. Other projects, over the years, include: bringing a Post Office to our community; the Welcome to Palmer Township signs at township borders; the Palmer Township sign at the Municipal Building Complex and the landscaping of that area; funding the Capital Campaign for the Charles Chrin Community Center; maintenance of the Route 22 exit ramps with business location signs; building the playground at the Community Center; the Miracle League Field of Northampton County; the BIP Pavilion at the Community Center; the electronic sign at Route 248 and Northampton Street; the Library beautification project; and the dog waste stations along the Palmer Township Bike Path.

The Palmer Township Board of Supervisors would like to thank the BIP for their unremitting support over the last 40 years, and for their continued dedication and funding of activities, events and projects in our great community.

The annual BIP Golf Outing that was rained out on September 19th was rescheduled and well attended on October 3rd. This year's proceeds from the event will go toward the construction of a pavilion located at the newly renovated Palmer Township Community Pool that will be opening for the 2017 season.

By the end of the 2016 growing season there were only five plants that were still alive out of the ten that were transplanted to the bike path gardens this year.
