### **Comprehensive Plan Update**

Over the next year, Palmer Township will be working to implement the first and most important action item of its newly adopted Comprehensive Plan – a complete re-write of the Township Zoning Ordinance. Whereas the Comprehensive Plan sets the goals and visions for the Township over the next ten to twenty years, the Zoning Ordinance is the legal document that sets the rules and regulations for the type, form, design and compatibility of land uses and activities. Zoning helps to ensure that standards of health, safety and welfare are upheld, and it contributes to the visual and functional character of the community.

The process of updating the Zoning Ordinance was kicked off with a public meeting held on June 13. Around 40 residents and business owners met at the Community Center to provide valuable input and feedback about how the zoning in our community can be improved. But that was just the beginning, there will be many other opportunities for you to have your say. Look for the Zoning Suggestion Box at Palmer Community Days, where your ideas can be submitted. #### PALMER TOWNSHIP BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

The picture was taken on April 28, 2018. The location is along the north side of the bike path at Fairview Park. At the left is the fence around the retention pond at New Creation UCC. The photographer is standing in the pathway through the garden leading over to Redner's Market. The flowering plants are daffodils, which were planted in October 2017. The bulbs were transplanted from a Palmer Township Beautification Project member's garden. In fact, all plants in the 250yard garden along the bike path at Fairview Park and the two gardens along the two chain link fences at the Palmer Post Office were all donated by Palmer residents. Sadly at least half of the plants that were planted in the Fairview Park garden since its inception in 2011 have died because of periodic drought conditions. All the growing medium is leaf compost, brought by Palmer Township trucks. Palmer Township authorities have always been very supportive of the three gardens. The only downside to leaf compost is it dries out much quicker than



normal quality topsoil. Plants with shallow root systems do not do well here. The positive side is the ease of planting plants and seeds and pulling out weeds with very little effort. Maintaining the three gardens with volunteers explains why the gardens don't look like Longwood Gardens. Knowhow is not the problem. A little more regular rainfall would help immensely.

At the time of writing this report there are plans for planting seeds of hibiscus and cleome plants in May in the Fairview Park garden. An attempt will be made to transplant the root structure of a few mature hibiscus plants. That would be like digging out a root ball of a tree. If the root ball is large enough the transplant may be successful. Volunteers and people in need of community service hours are welcome. Walkers on the bike path are always encouraged to bring a bottle of water and adopt some plants and keep them thriving by giving them drinks. Frequently, the more water the larger the plant. Met a man walking the bike path who said he comes all the way from the town of Northampton just to walk the Palmer Bike Path. We can make a difference in people's lives.

Donate if in good condition, or schedule a bulk item pickup, if available. Check **earth911.com** for a local drop off site.



NO Textiles, Bedding, Rugs & Carpet

Donate these items if they are in good condition. Large quantities may require special disposal.



NO Hoses, Holiday Lights, Hangers & Extension Cords

They wrap around equipment and can shut down an entire facility! They all go in the trash.



NO Plastic Bags, Film/ Sheeting & Flexible Film Packaging

Take plastic bags back to a local grocer to keep bags clean and dry, and prevent them from shutting down recycling facilities. Visit **plasticfilmrecycling.org** to find a drop off location near you.



NO Paper Napkins, Plates, Cups & Tissues

Compost if possible, and remember to recycle the cardboard tube.



NO Polystyrene Foam

Foam and plastic to-go containers are not recyclable curbside. Find drop off programs for items like foam packing peanuts at **earth911.com**.



### NO Tires, Auto Parts & Scrap Metal

(Not in recycling or trash) Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. Contact local scrap recyclers or retail tire stores for recycling options, or check **earth911.com** for a drop off center near you.



NO Concrete, Wood & Construction Debris

Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. You may be able to schedule a bulk item pickup – otherwise throw it in the trash or order a roll off bin by contacting Waste Management Customer Service.



**NO Yard Waste & Wood** Compost or put in your yard waste cart, if available. Otherwise, it belongs in the trash.



NO Non-Recyclable Plastic

Not everything that is plastic is recyclable! Recycle only food & beverage bottles, jugs and tubs.

### **Recycling Right – Why it Matters**

China, the country responsible for accepting the majority of our recyclables, has begun to limit the quantity of material it accepts for recycling and has put in place strict quality standards (aka clean recyclables, no trash in the recyclables.) These changes are dramatically affecting the recycling industry.

When non-recyclable items (contamination) end up in our recycling loads, the result can be turning the entire load into trash and increase processing costs and/or additional service charges.



### When in doubt, leave it out!

Let's help to keep our waste and recycling costs low and work to ensure the long-term sustainability of our recycling programs and the recycling industry strong.

### Special Curbside Collections

Put items curbside on your regularly scheduled collection day and they will be collected that day or within that week by a separate truck other than your regular collection vehicles.

- Bulk Item Collection: Weeks of September 17 and December 3
- White Goods Collection: Week of October 1
- Yard Waste Collection: Week of November 5



### Hours of Operation:

- Childcare hours are Monday through Friday.
- Before Care hours 6:45 A.M. to 8:30 A.M. (or bus pick up time)
- After Care hours (bus drop off time) 3:30 P.M. to 6:00 P.M.
- On a half day childcare will be offered
- On an early dismissal day care will be offered from 12:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

The program will not run on any snow day cancellations. We will not have staff available these days. This includes any 2-hour delay that is later changed to a cancellation. In case of a 2-hour delay that is changed to a cancellation, all before care program children will need to be picked up by a parent or guardian before 11 A.M. Please plan accordingly.

### **Program Content:**

### Sign-In/Out:

### **Transportation:**

### Fees and Payments:

A \$100.00 membership fee for the year is required to guarantee your child's spot for the before & after school program. The program application and fee are mandatory and must be completed and received by the CCCC before your child is accepted into the program.

- Before school daily rate: \$8.00
- After school daily rate: \$12.00
- Before & After Care daily rate: \$16.00

There is an additional charge of \$10 per every 15 minutes for late pickups, due at time of pick up. Repeated late pickups may result in loss of childcare services. Payment is due at the end of each month within 5 business days of receipt. The payment schedule is from September to May. The final payment is due at the end of the current school year upon receipt of bill. Payments can be made at the front desk or by mail. There is a 2% fee for all credit card transactions.
