PALMER TOWNSHIP BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

At the end of September 2017 thirty baby butterfly bushes were planted in the garden along the bike path at Fairview Park. They were transplanted from a member's home garden. Butterfly bushes self-seed very successfully and if dug out with enough soil to cover the roots the process is almost always successful. Keeping the roots wet is required. In November 2017 we had weeds eliminated and daffodil and iris bulbs planted in the Fairview Park garden. The question to be answered by Palmer residents is: Do I want to have hummingbirds and butterflies feeding in my yard? The plants in the picture are cannas and butterfly bushes. These plants attract hummingbirds better than my feeder, to my delight. Two sides of this garden contain large blue spruce and white pine trees. These provide good protection for the animals. Cannas are tropical, this means that their root structures are dug out of the ground and kept in a basement in buckets or garbage cans after the first hard frost. Palmer residents may have some of the roots at the end of April or the beginning of May 2018. Over the years a lot of leaf compost from the Berk's street compost pile has been added to the garden's soil. The picture shows how tall the cannas can grow with a lot of sunlight. The canna roots multiply so giving some away every year is a good thing. If interested contact Dave at d.carr@rcn.com or 610-704-5868.

 - <u>Penn Pump Pavilion Permit</u> *Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
 - Penn Pump Picnic Permit *Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people. Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. Residents \$50.00 & Non-Residents \$100.00
- **Riverview** Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8AM-10:00PM Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- **BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race** Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8AM– 10PM Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00 **Briarcliffe is unavailable for rent on weekends and holidays**

Protecting Stream Water Quality from Suburban Runoff

In developed suburban areas, a large amount of the land surface is covered by buildings and pavement, which do not allow rain and snowmelt to soak into the ground. Instead, most developed areas rely on storm drains or swales to carry large amounts of runoff from roof and paved areas to nearby waterways. The storm water runoff can carry pollutants such as oil, pet waste, chemicals, sediment, and lawn fertilizers directly to streams and rivers, where they can seriously harm water quality. To protect surface water quality and groundwater resources, residents can:

- Reduce the amount of fertilizers and chemicals (pesticides, herbicides, etc.) being used
- Clean up pet waste and dispose in the garbage
- Keep vehicles in good mechanical condition to eliminate grease, oil and anti-freeze leaks
- Do not over apply de-icing salts
- Residents can pick up trash before it gets into storm drains and swales
- Do not dump anything into storm inlets or drains.

These pollutants can harm fish and wildlife populations, kill native vegetation, foul drinking water supplies, and make recreational areas unsafe and unpleasant.

Ordinance Update

Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.

Depositing snow prohibited: No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner, deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire hydrant or privately owned property without the permission from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.

When is a Permit Required?

The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code and the ordinances of Palmer Township require permits for many types of projects. Activities requiring permits include:

- Any structural change/alteration
- Plumbing
- Electrical
- Mechanical/HVAC (new and replacement)
- Water heaters (new and replacement)
- Reroofing

- Replacement windows
- Replacement siding
- Decks
- Pools (permanent and temporary)
- Finished basements
- Driveways (replacement, expansion and resurface)
- Signs (except political signs) and banners
- Additional living space conversions
- · Patios and patio roofs
- Fences (temporary and permanent)
- Retaining walls
- Sheds and carports (accessory structures)

The above list may not include all necessary permits. You may contact the Permit or Building Department at (610) 253-7191 for more information.


The amount of heat that is generated by charging a cellular phone could cause a fire if resting on a combustible material. Please do not sleep with your cell phones charging on the bed.

"Who Was" Book Group


"Who Was" Book Group is a non-fiction book discussion designed for kids ages 7-13 years old.




