



#### PALMER TOWNSHIP BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

#### **Palmer Township Beautification**

Residents come and go from the Palmer Post office every day and have the opportunity to enjoy the beauty of the plants that line the Greenwood Avenue chain link fences. Most people can carry a bottle of water with them while walking in the community. Taking some time to water plants as you pass by can help extend the life of the plants. The plants will continue to thrive and will be stunningly beautiful for all to enjoy. The planted daylilies were large and vibrant where they were planted. Now (November), some of them are smaller and one needed to be removed. There are two problems that contribute to this: periodic lack of rain and leaf compost that is the only growing medium and dries quickly. The only requirement is that we wait until there are no oncoming cars before watering the plants because it is a dangerous stretch of road. The plan for the 2020 growing season is to add more daylilies and a few Russian Iris and Calla lilies with solid white flowers. The Fairview Park garden has similar problems, including lack of rain and leaf compost. There are plans to plant large amounts of hibiscus and cleome seeds. If you have ever thought about adding some plants to your landscape in 2020, now would be a great time to start planning! Add some leaf compost from the Berks Street free compost pile and mix it with your soil when the weather is warmer. The compost is free and available on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays to Palmer residents. The Palmer Township Beautification Project chairperson, Dave Carr, gives his opinion of garden planning. "I have lots of hibiscus, cleome, and calla lily seeds that are harvested every year. You will do me a favor by taking some. [I would] be pleased to discuss your particular gardening needs. Always a weed to pull, so anyone who needs community service hours or just likes getting ones hands in leaf compost is encouraged to make Palmer more beautiful than it already is." The attached picture shows a stand of hibiscus. Your stand could look like that in three years and could flower within the first year. Remember when planning hibiscus that the plants prefers more sunlight. Take some time and help us add to the beauty of Palmer Township! Dave Carr, chairperson d.carr@rcn.com 610-704-5868

#### **FEES:**

Penn Pump- There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00AM–10PM

#### **Penn Pump Pavilion Permit**

\*Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00

#### Penn Pump Picnic Permit

\*Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people.

Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion.

Palmer Residents \$50 & Non-Residents \$100

**Riverview**- Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8AM–10:00PM Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00

**BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race** – Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8AM–10PM

Palmer Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00 \*Briarcliffe is unavailable for rent on weekends from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

# News from the Business, Industrial and Professional Association (BIP) of Palmer Township

The BIP's guest speaker at our June business luncheon was Becky A. Bradley, Executive Director of the Lehigh Valley Planning Commission (LVPC). Becky began by stating each day in the Lehigh Valley there are 14,334,600 miles driven in and through the Valley. This is an increase of 678,600 miles traveled per day in the past two years. Despite this increase the state and federal dollars for transportation projects have not increased in nearly a decade. Because of declining gas tax revenues and

state/federal budget deficit, the Valley may see as much as a 30% drop in transportation funding to the region. This will be a challenge to the Lehigh Valley Transportation Study, which is the transportation planning and funding component of the LVPC.

Becky indicated that 77% of the Lehigh Valley's land is developed. This is an average of 1,280 acres developed per year. Between January and May of this year, 2,604 acres have been proposed for development. A high percentage of that is industrial and warehousing. For the past couple of years, the LVPC has been working on the regional Comprehensive Plan which is called FutureLV. To this Bradley said, "If we want to maintain what we value most we must have a different strategy." Therefore, the working goals being developed include:


- An efficient and coordinated development pattern
- A connected mixed-transportation region
- A protected and vibrant environment
- A competitive creative and sustainable region
- A safe, healthy, inclusive and livable community

In ending her talk, Becky quoted Albert Einstein, "The world as we have created it is a process of our thinking. It cannot be changed without changing our thinking." This is how the LVPC, the counties, and the 62 municipalities need to look at the future of the Lehigh Valley.


#### **Fall Season Opens**



#### MIXED RECYCLABLES BIN

- **Plastics:** rinsed #1 through #7, no polystyrene foam. Attach lids.
- Glass: rinsed clear, brown and green bottles and jars. Discard lids.
- Metals: rinsed aluminum, tin and steel cans, and household metals, pots and pans.








- **Food and beverage cartons:** milk, cream, egg substitutes, orange juice, soup, broth, and wine cartons, and juice boxes
- **Corrugated cardboard:** all sizes including shipping, shoe, gift, and cereal boxes. No need to bundle, cut or flatten. No freezer boxes with wax coating.







#### **Clearance of Snow from Public Sidewalks**

Please remember that all snow, ice, or sleet shall be removed from all public sidewalks abutting your property within 12 hours after the snow has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon. This includes the accessibility ramps located at street intersections. Whenever it may be impossible to remove all snow, sleet, or ice, which may have become compacted by travel or formed on sidewalks so as to present a slippery surface, ashes, cinders, sand or any other suitable substance shall be applied as to facilitate safe walking upon the sidewalks.

Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.

§109-3(SS) - Depositing snow prohibited: No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner,



deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire hydrant or privately owned property without the permission from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.

#### When is a Permit Required?

The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code, as well as, the ordinances of Palmer Township requires permits for many types of projects. Activities requiring permits include:

- Any structural change/alteration
- Plumbing
- Water heaters (new and replacement)
- · Electrical · Mechanical/HVAC (new and replacement) Reroofing
- Replacement windows
- Replacement siding
- · Decks
- Pools (permanent and temporary)
- Finished basements
- Driveways (replacement, expansion and resurface)
- · Signs (except political signs) and banners
- · Additional living space conversions
- · Patios and patio roofs
- Fences (temporary and permanent)
- · Retaining walls
- Sheds and carports (accessory structures)

Building code regulations require minimum standards for design and construction to ensure the safety and welfare of the occupants. The above list may not include all necessary permits. You may contact the Permit Department at (610)253-7191 for more information.

Winter driving can be hazardous and scary, especially in northern regions that get a lot of snow and ice. Additional preparations can help make a trip safer, or help motorists deal with an emergency. This sheet provides safety information to your residents to help prevent motor vehicle injuries due to winter storms.

#### THE THREE P'S OF SAFE WINTER DRIVING:

**PREPARE** for the trip; **PROTECT** yourself;
and **PREVENT** crashes on the road.

#### **PREPARE**

- Maintain Your Car: Check battery, tire tread, and windshield wipers, keep your windows clear, put no-freeze fluid in the washer reservoir, and check your antifreeze.
- **Have On Hand:** flashlight, jumper cables, abrasive material (sand, kitty litter, even floor mats), shovel, snow brush and ice scraper, warning devices (like flares) and blankets. For long trips, add food and water, medication and cell phone.
- **Stopped or Stalled?** Stay in your car, don't overexert, put bright markers on antenna or windows and shine dome light, and, if you run your car, clear exhaust pipe and run it just enough to stay warm.
- **Plan Your Route**: Allow plenty of time (check the weather and leave early if necessary), be familiar with the maps/ directions, and let others know your route and arrival time.

#### **Practice Cold Weather Driving!**

- During the daylight, rehearse maneuvers slowly on ice or snow in an empty lot.
- · Steer into a skid.
- Know what your brakes will do: stomp on antilock brakes, pump on non-antilock brakes.
- Stopping distances are longer on water-covered snow and ice.
- Don't idle for a long time with the windows up or in an enclosed space.

#### PROTECT YOURSELF

- Buckle up and use child safety seats properly.
- Never place a rear-facing infant seat in front of an air bag.
- Children 12 and under are much safer in the back seat.

#### PREVENT CRASHES

- · Drugs and alcohol never mix with driving.
- · Slow down and increase distances between cars.
- Keep your eyes open for pedestrians walking in the road.
- Avoid fatigue Get plenty of rest before the trip, stop at least every three hours, and rotate drivers if possible.
- If you are planning to drink, designate a sober driver.
