Xpress Bill Pay is Here!

Now you can pay your bills online. Palmer XDIES BILL PAY Township has partnered with Xpress Bill Pay,

the premier provider for online payment systems. All you need is an internet connection through a web browser and an email address. Once you sign up for your free account and start using this service, you'll wonder how you ever got along without it! It's simple to use. Every month or quarter we'll send you a reminder email to let you know when your bill is online. Then, you just log into your account at xpressbillpay.com and view your bill. You can also see two years' history of your account online (once the history is built), so you can compare your current bill to a previous bill. When you're ready to pay your bill, select a payment type. You can pay with credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer. Enter the information and you're done! It's that easy, and it only takes you a few minutes each month (or quarter). Or you can set up your bill on Auto Pay and have it automatically paid for you each month (or quarter)! We offered this service at the request of our customers — you asked, and we delivered! To sign up, go to palmertwp.com and click on the "Utility & Trash Payments" button and follow the instructions. And remember, it's free to sign up and free to use.

NEW ORDINANCE: Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.


Depositing snow prohibited: No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner, deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire hydrant or privately-owned property without the permission from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.

2019 Palmer Special Curbside Waste and Recycling Collections

(Placed curbside the night before your regularly scheduled collection day; items will be collected that week by a separate vehicle)

Yard Waste Collection: Weeks of June 3 and November 4

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, garden clippings) will be collected curbside. Place your yard waste in any open top container (your old green, round recycling container or a clean trash container, NOT YOUR AUTOMATED CART), tie with cotton or hemp twine in bundles no larger than 3' x 3' x 3', and weighing no more than 40lbs, or place in compostable paper bags (NO PLASTIC BAGS, ROPE OR TWINE). No grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, any wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter; human or animal excrement; noxious weeds or soil contaminated with hazardous substances.

Christmas Tree Collection: Weeks of January 6, 13 and 20, 2020

Please remove tinsel, ornaments, and tree stands. Trees in plastic bags will not be collected.

Household White Goods/Metals Collection: Weeks of April 1 and September 30

Appliances such as air conditioners, refrigerators and freezers (remove doors; All Freon must be removed professionally and tagged prior to being placed at curb), washers, dryers, hot water heaters, dehumidifiers, bicycles, and lawnmowers (oil and gas removed), BBQ grills (gas and/or charcoal removed), and various other household metal items.

Bulk Item Collection: Weeks of March 4, May 13, September 16 and December 2

Each residence is allowed to put out one (1) bulk item during each of these collection weeks, on their regularly scheduled collection day. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the waste cart; and the general rule of thumb is an item the approximate dimensions and weight of a standard size sofa that can be carried by two (2) men. Acceptable items include furniture, mattresses, rolled up and tied rugs no larger than 3' x 6'. Unacceptable materials that will not be collected include construction materials, hazardous waste, tires, yard waste, grass clippings, or additional household trash.

Unusable paint can be placed in the trash if dry. Small amounts can be left open to dry or poured over newspaper to dry. Kitty litter will absorb and dry out larger amounts.

Protect Palmer Township and Downstream Environments from Illicit Discharges to the Storm Sewer System

Illicit discharges include dry weather flows from storm water outfalls along stream banks or an unusual looking or odorous discharge from a storm water outfall during wet weather.

If an illicit discharge is found, do not investigate further; this material may be harmful to your health and safety. Immediately, notify the Palmer Township Public Services Department at 610-253-7191 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (weekdays); and, after hours, a message can be left at the Northampton County non-emergency phone number 610-759-2200.

Some examples of illicit discharges are automotive fluids (antifreeze, used motor oil, brake fluid, fuel, etc.), concrete slurry, paint products and solvents. Visual examples of illicit discharges are shown to the right.

PALMER TOWNSHIP BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

A short time ago, a Palmer resident came to my house and took six Calla Lily seed pods. He had read the November 2018 article which explained in detail Calla Lily plants and their success growing in our climate. Only one other person came to get the seeds that were, and still are offered for free. As of this date there are twenty small seed pods remaining. A very rough estimate would be 500 to 1000 seeds are available in the seed pods.

Two years ago, some hibiscus seeds were planted at the very west end of the bike path garden at Fairview Park. To my delight they all germinated. Some of them flowered in the first year and since they are perennials they continued to flower this summer. Their exact location is on the path side of the tall ornamental grasses. The nice thing about hibiscus plants is that they can have about ten flowers on a single stem. These plants grow about six feet tall in fertile soil with hours of sunlight. The hibiscus plants in my gardens produced six pounds of seeds in 2017, about half of them were given away. That leaves about three pounds plus the seeds that were harvested in 2018 that I plan to separate out of their seed pods on a warm day in January 2019. That is a lot of seeds. My ideal plan for these seeds would be for many of them to be cast in the Fairview Park garden in April or May 2019. This would entail roughing up the leaf compost, casting the seeds, and gently raking the surface. They do not need to be planted to any depth. The flowers are mainly white or red.

What I have included is perhaps more significant to people who may grow some of these plants in their garden. The picture is of one hibiscus plant taken from about three feet above the soil at 45 degrees. The stems have been cut off about five inches above the soil. The stems





are dead and never will grow again. New stems will grow from the roots out of the ground around where these stems are. It is good to have short stems, so they do not interfere with the next years' stems. The dead stems could be cut back even closer to the ground. I like this length, so I can easily see where the plants are while walking in the garden. Help is needed because of nerve damage to my left leg resulting in limited stability. The instability explains why the gardens were not maintained adequately during the 2018 growing season. Those needing volunteer hours may contact Dave at d.carr@rcn.com or 610.704.5868

Community Service Award - Barry Fulmer

The Community Service Award recognizes individuals and/or groups who by their service to others or contributions to the Palmer community help to distinguish Palmer as a caring community.

Civic Trust Awards

This award is the highest tribute that the association of professionals can pay to a business, corporation or individual conducting commerce within the township boundaries of Palmer. It is intended to recognize significant physical improvement to existing properties, as well as new structures, which through the free-enterprise system, in turn, make an outstanding contribution to the business climate of the township. This year there were three recipients:

BIP recognized Palmer Township for their new Public Works / Public Utilities facility. When the property was purchased for the Palmer Township Parks Facility and





Recycling Center on Hartley Avenue, there was foresight to consolidate the different departments to one area on the 19.32 adjacent acres and build the Palmer Township Public Works / Utilities Building.

Boyle Construction served as general contractor for the new building, which brought together Palmer Township's Public Works, Utilities, and Sewage Departments under one roof. The 42,500 square foot facility features offices, a kennel, storage, a truck wash, a training room, a service center, 12 double-door truck bays, and 14 single-door truck bays. The facility's site allows truck bay access from both the east and west sides of the building, with a 35-foot aisle between the two-bay entrances and space for future equipment purchases. The Township Salt shed is also located on the rear of the property.

The new building includes offices for the Superintendent of Public Works/Parks/Utilities and his Assistant and there is an office for the Assistant Superintendent of Public Utilities. The Public Works and Utilities Department is home to 18 employees.

BIP also recognized Lehigh Valley Center for Sight. An established group of Ophthalmologists in the Lehigh Valley, which began 40 years ago, and specializes in glaucoma, retina, cataracts, LASIK and oculofacial plastics.

With their main office on Fairmont Street in Allentown, the practice decided Palmer Township would be the perfect location to reach the eastern region of the Lehigh Valley. They purchased the building at 3959 William Penn Highway, which was formerly Saylor's Florist. After purchasing the building, the renovations began.

The reception area welcomes you with a modern design; there are six exam rooms to serve their patients and they also provide complete eye exams within their optical department. The lower level is renovated into a kitchen and break room for the employees. The outside color scheme and landscaping fits in its surroundings and offers plenty of parking convenient to the building. They are happy to build on their patient relationships in this location and have settled in nicely in Palmer Township.

BIP's third Civic Trust recipient this year is the law firm of Goudsouzian & Associates. They have been in existence since 1995 and have been in Palmer Township since the year 2000. Formerly in the office building at 2925 William Penn Highway. The firm recently purchased the building at 2940 William Penn Highway that was a real estate office, and renovations began.

New doors were installed as you enter the building, new flooring and carpet throughout, the HVAC system was replaced, open spaces were converted into offices. They currently have 16 offices and three conference rooms, and they have made use of all three floors. Outside, they are ADA

compliant with a handicap accessible ramp, a new surveillance system was installed, and the parking area was extended and paved.



in the Tribute In Lights. After darkness set in, the tower lights illuminate Lower Manhattan in remembrance to all.




I look forward to the start of this program. Over the next several months, our objective is for the Officers to begin training with the proper operation and care of the body-worn cameras.




