Pride in Palmer

Palmer Township has always been innovative and a leader within the Lehigh Valley in many things as diverse as Curbside Recycling; Household Hazardous Waste Collection, to the development of an extensive trail system for use by Township's residents and visitors. A few of the primary amenities that people are attracted to in Palmer are its natural beauty, public parks and multitude of services. These features are being blemished due to an extensive amount of litter found throughout the Township.

An obvious increase in the number of Lehigh Valley residents in the last two decades has resulted in an excessive wave of litter found along your Township's roadways. This is becoming a real problem well beyond the capacity of the Township's Maintenance Crews and volunteer residents to overcome. The litter is not only unsightly; it clogs drainage grates and systems, and further damages the environment as it washes into our local waterways.

In an effort to combat the excessive wave of litter, Palmer's elected officials ask each resident and business owner to take a moment, either on a daily or weekly basis and especially prior to a rain event, to remove any and all litter found on their property and at curbside. Recycle what you can and put the rest in a trash container. Studies have shown that "litter begets litter"; in other words, people tend to litter where they see other litter has accumulated.

A collective action by those who live, work and play in Palmer Township will reflect pride in community and will keep Palmer Beautiful!

Lehigh Valley Plant A Row Program

Are you a backyard veggie gardener? Do you have more produce than your family can consume? If so, consider donating your excess to the Lehigh Valley Plant A Row program.

The latest data available from Second Harvest Food Bank shows that some 60,000 people in the Valley need food assistance every month. Lehigh Valley Plant a Row seeks to aid these food-insecure individuals and families by asking home gardeners to consider planting an extra row of produce or bringing any excess to donation drop off points. The donation/collection sites

around the Palmer Township area include the St. Luke's Anderson Campus and Louise Moore Park community gardens. Each week, volunteers transport donated produce from these collection points to local food pantries.



Since the program's launch in 2016, over 10,000 pounds of fresh fruits and veggies have been donated by backyard gardeners. The donations all went to local food pantries and were enough to provide a serving of nutritious fresh produce for over 23,000 meals.

Business, Industrial and Professional Association of Palmer Township News - BIP

The BIP held their annual January Business Luncheon on Wednesday, January 22, 2020 at the Marblehead Chowder House. As we begin every new membership year, a presentation was made by the leadership of the township who provides a "State of the Township" address. Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, Dave Colver, began the program by giving a summary of various projects completed in 2019 and what is on the schedule for 2020 projects. He also talked about various private projects and developments which are underway in the township.

Township Manager, Bob Williams, followed with a summary of the administration's plans for 2020. The highlights included the fact that there is no property tax increase for township residents again in 2020. He reviewed several large capital improvement projects that will be taking place, to include improvements to 28 miles of township roads. Other capital improvement items include updates to several township buildings and upgrades that will be made at Riverview Park and Penn Pump Park.



Helping Our Community

Police Chief Larry Palmer ended the presentation by giving a summary of the Police Department. Chief Palmer reviewed statistics with the members noting serious crimes dropped by 6% from 2018 to 2019, and the non-serious crimes dropped 5% for the same time period. Chief reported there were a total of 247 arrests and 290 motor vehicle citations. The officers also began wearing body-worn cameras. Chief Palmer reported that Detective James Taylor was awarded Officer of the Year by the Northampton County Council of Police Chiefs; long-time officer Dave Brotzman retired; the Chief created the position of Sergeant of Operational Support and Technology; and, the department conducted several active shooter training sessions for churches in the township.

2020 Upcoming Special Curbside Collections

(Place items curbside for pick-up on your regularly scheduled collection day; item will be collected that week by a separate vehicle)

YARD WASTE COLLECTIONS: Weeks of June 1 and November 9

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, garden clippings). Place your yard waste in any open top container (your old green, round recycling container or a clean trash container (NOT YOUR AUTOMATED CART), and/or tie with cotton or hemp twine in bundles no larger than 3' x 3' x 3', and weighing no more than 40lbs, or place in compostable paper bags (NO PLASTIC BAGS, ROPE OR TWINE). No grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, any wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter, animal excrement, noxious weeds, or bamboo.

METAL/WHITE GOODS COLLECTION: Week of September 28

Appliances such as washers, dryers, stoves, microwaves, hot water heaters; air conditioners, dehumidifiers, refrigerators and freezers (remove doors and all Freon must be removed professionally and tagged with certification of removal prior to being placed at curb); steel or aluminum tire rims (w/o tires), bicycles, BBQ grills, and walk-behind lawnmowers (oil, gas, and propane removed). No electronics or dishwashers (most are no longer made of metal). Metal and white goods can be taken year-round to the Palmer Township Recycling Center, 3600 Hartley Avenue.

BULK ITEM COLLECTIONS: Weeks of May 11, September 14 and November 30

Each residence can put out one (1) bulk item during each of these collection weeks. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the waste cart; with the general rule of thumb being an item the approximate dimensions and weight of a standard size sofa that can be carried by two (2) men. Acceptable items include dishwashers, furniture, mattresses, rolled up and tied rugs no larger than 3' x 6'. No electronics, construction materials, hazardous waste, tires, yard waste, grass clippings, or additional household trash. If you can't wait for a bulk item collection, you may request a special bulk item pickup by contacting Waste Management Customer Service at 800-621-2100. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township, PA to receive the Township's \$25 per item collection price. Be sure to get the confirmation number in the event follow-up is needed.

SPECIAL VOLUME COLLECTION

This collection is available for large amounts of household trash only and must be bagged or in cans (not to exceed 32-gallon size or 40 lb. weight limit). No bulk or white goods/metal items. Residents must schedule and pay in advance by contacting Waste Management (800) 621-2100. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township, PA in order to receive the price of \$25 per collection. Be sure to get the confirmation number in the event follow-up is needed.

THE "RAGS" WON'T PASS, BUT THE COSTS WILL

Easton Area Joint Sewer Authority

When it comes to "rags" and the sewer system, they don't mix! They are small, but mighty, and can cause very costly damage to wastewater equipment. The consequences of the damages and repairs will be reflected in your sewer rates. In the wastewater industry the term "rags" is used to describe wipes, towels, shop rags, industrial rags, cleaning wipes, etc.; basically, materials tougher than toilet paper, that are not able to break down in the sewer system.

Now maybe you are thinking, what happens when I flush "rags" down the toilet? They disappear from my house and/or place of work to never be seen again. Well...that's not the case for those of us that work in the wastewater industry. "Rags" can clog sewer lines, get caught in pumps and wastewater equipment, causing them to malfunction and need to be repaired, or worse, replaced. Tens of thousands of dollars are spent at the wastewater treatment plants alone repairing damage caused by these "rags."



These repairs not only are costly but may also lead to dangerous confined space maintenance done by our staff. The EAJSA Wastewater staff takes great pride in the wastewater treatment quality. Please do your part by throwing away "rags" so sewer rate payer's money can be put to better use by upgrading and improving equipment to continue our environmental stewardship of high-quality discharge to the Delaware River, instead of costly repairs.

It is the Parks & Recreation Department's goal to provide citizens with a safe environment in which recreational opportunity can be maximized. Due to the wide variety of patron needs and use of Township property, it is necessary to establish the following rules and regulations.

Event representative must have permit with them for duration of the event

RESERVATIONS: All reservations must be completed in person at the Charles Chrin Community Center of Palmer Township, located at 4100 Green Pond Road Palmer, PA 18045 Ph. 610-252-2098. *Pavilion rentals are prohibited during Palmer Community Weekend.



FEES:

- **Penn Pump:** There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00AM–10PM
 - 1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit *Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
 - 2. Penn Pump Picnic Permit *Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people. Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. Residents \$50 & Non-Residents \$100
- **Riverview:** Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8AM–10:00PM. Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- **BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race:** Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8AM–10PM. Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00. *Briarcliffe is unavailable for rent on weekends and holidays*

TEMPORARY POOLS

All temporary pools capable of holding more than 24 inches of water DO require a permit and inspection each year the pool is erected. The permit must be obtained before installation occurs. Use of the pool shall be prohibited until an inspection is obtained and approval has been issued by the Building Department.

Please be aware that pools with heights between 24 inches and 48 inches will require a permanent barrier in accordance with the 2015 International Residential Code/2015 International Pool & Spa Code. Also, overhead power lines, grade slopes and zoning setbacks will have an impact as to the allowable location of a pool. Call the Building Code Department with any questions at 610-253-7191.





GRASS/NOXIOUS VEGETATION AND SIDEWALK CLEARANCE

Spring is finally here and it is time to put down that snow shovel and start-up the lawn mower! Palmer's ordinances limit the height of grass to a maximum of 6-inches.

Also, please maintain the sidewalk clear of impeding tree branches, bushes and decorative vegetation by cutting such back so that the full width of the sidewalk, to a height of 7-feet, is accessible for the safety of pedestrians.

Topics covered include vehicle washing, vehicle maintenance, winter deicing, pet waste, lawn and garden care, rain barrels and rain gardens.

Please be advised that some of the storm water quantity and quality control measures such as drywells and infiltration basins listed for private lots may promote sinkhole development in limestone regions such as the Lehigh Valley.

All the soap, scum, and oily grit runs along the curb. Then into the storm drain and directly into our lakes, streams and into coastal waters including the Chesapeake Bay. And that causes pollution which is unhealthy for fish. So how do you avoid this whole mess? Easy. Wash your car on grass or gravel instead of the street. Or better yet, take it to a car wash where the water gets treated and recycled.

All outside burning is prohibited except as required by permit in code Section 307.2. In addition, only bonfires approved by the Palmer Township Board of Supervisors may be allowed and will be required the issuance of a permit.

Palmer Township Police Detective James Taylor was presented with the 18th Annual Nathan Ogden Award from the Northampton County Chiefs of Police Association

Detective Taylor was assigned the investigation into the November 21, 2016, homicide of Michael Davis, outside Davis' home. His killers, Gregory Lewis Jr. and Vaughn Felix, had been robbing area cellphone stores, sparking an investigation spanning Lehigh, Northampton and Warren counties.



Gregory Lewis Jr. and Vaughn Felix wanted to kidnap Davis and drive him back to the Forks Township Verizon store where he worked so they could rob it. Davis resisted, and Felix shot him.

In June, Lewis was convicted at trial of second-degree murder and related charges, and Felix pleaded guilty to murder and other counts. Both are currently serving life sentences.


Detective Taylor was nominated for this Award by Northampton County Assistant District Attorney Patricia Mulqueen. Bethlehem Police Chief Mark DiLuzio, Chairman of the Northampton County Police Chiefs' Association, congratulated Taylor for his "tenacious work and professionalism" in investigating the murder of Davis that led to the convictions of both Gregory Lewis Jr. and Vaughn Felix.


The award is named in Honor of Northampton County Deputy Sheriff Nathan Ogden, who was killed in the line of duty Jan. 20, 1771. Deputy Sheriff Ogden was trying to arrest fugitive, Lazarus Stewart, on a warrant at Fort Dupree, now Hanover Township, during the Pennamite-Yankee land rights war, according to the police chiefs' association. Deputy Sheriff Ogden was shot in the chest and died from his wounds.

Deputy Sheriff Ogden is believed to be the first law Enforcement official killed in the line of duty, in the United States.

Detective James Taylor has been with the Palmer Township Police Department for 20 years, working in Patrol for 11 years before becoming a Detective in 2010. He is a graduate of the 56th class of the Allentown Police Academy, in 1995. He was joined at the presentation by his wife, Donna, and their daughters, Samantha and Sydney. Detective Taylor is the first Palmer Police Officer to receive this Award.

The Palmer Township Police Department is pleased to announce today's graduation of Sergeant Vasa Faasuamalie from the School of Police Staff and Command (SPSC) at Northwestern University.

Sergeant Faasuamalie successfully completed the ten-week Staff and Command program held at the Bucks County Public Safety Training Center, in Doylestown Township, Pennsylvania, from October 7th, 2019, through February 14th, 2020. The program, which was implemented by the Center for Public Safety in 1983, has graduated over 18,000 students both nationally and internationally. He was enrolled in SPSC class #471 which accommodated a total of 24 students for a ten-week period.

The School of Police Staff and Command provides upper-level college instruction in a total of twenty- seven core blocks of instruction and additional optional blocks during each session. The major topics of study include: Leadership, Human Resources, Employee Relations, Organizational

Behavior, Applied Statistics, Planning and Policy Development, Budgeting and Resource Allocation. Upon completion, students may be awarded a total of 6 units of undergraduate credit from Northwestern University in Evanston Illinois.

The Center for Public safety was established at Northwestern University in 1936 with the specific goal of expanding university-based education and training for the Law Enforcement Community. Since its inception, the Center has broadened its original objective and now provides a variety of courses and programs in the area of Police training, Management Training, and Executive Development.

The Palmer Township Police Department anticipates a variety of benefits from Sergeant Faasuamalie's attendance at this program.
