Bike Path Crossing Safety Improvements

Township Public Works staff recently completed the installation of safety improvements at 4 bike path crossing locations in the Township.

- At the Easton Area High School entrance on South 25th Street, new gates and signage were installed to stop bike path traffic approaching the intersection.
- At the Easton Area High School entrance on William Penn Highway and across the street behind Rite-Aid, new gates and signage were installed to stop traffic approaching the street and directing pedestrians and cyclists to cross at the signalized intersection at 25th Street.
- On South 25th Street by Aldi, new gates and signage were installed to stop traffic approaching the street and new pavement markings were installed to provide greater visibility of the crossing to approaching motorists.
- On Stones Crossing Road, new gates and signage were installed to stop traffic approaching the street and new pavement markings were installed to provide greater visibility of the crossing to approaching motorists.

The project was paid for through local Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding through the Lehigh Valley Transportation Study. TAP projects help build pedestrian and bicycle facilities, improve access to public transportation, create safe routes to school, create trail projects that serve a transportation purpose, while promoting safety and mobility.

Bleeding Heart Plants

It is time to plant bleeding heart plants for the 2021 growing season. The best time to plant bleeding heart seeds is November in Palmer. Three months in the cold ground is required. Spending time developing the Fairview Park Bike Path garden has allowed the opportunity for passersby to ask what the heart shaped flowers are called. There are multiple bleeding heart plants growing in the 250-yard garden. It is easy to see the heart shaped flowers with the "blood" growing out of the bottom of each flower, which gives it its name, bleeding heart. There is one bleeding heart plant in the east side garden at the Palmer Post Office. Each fertilized flower grows a seed pod that looks like a miniature green bean seed pod. A week or more later each seed pod grows pure white round seeds. Authorities say that they are not able to grow a new plant. A few weeks later the white seeds turn totally black. Black seeds if planted in November will grow new plants in the spring. If the green seed pod is left alone it will shrivel, twist, break open and the black seeds will fall to the ground. This process is called self-seeding. The plants prefer



less sunlight. The leaves and flowers are shriveled near the end of July. Seeds of both color flowers were saved during the summer of 2020. Call or email me so you can get yours for free. Press them very gently into a soil compost mixture. Hibiscus, calla lily, cleome, and butterfly bush seeds are also available for free. Let's All Work Together to Keep Palmer Township Beautiful

Something we see daily yet give very little thought to, except when there is a severe rain incident and some of our streets become flooded, is your Palmer Township's **Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System** (MS4) which is designed to collect/convey only stormwater, also called "runoff." Please note some of the older developed areas of the Township do not have storm sewers or have systems not designed to current standards. The Federal Clean Water Act as administered by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's

Municipal Separate Storm Sewer (MS4) Program regulates how Municipalities that are considered urbanized areas are to enact an MS4 Plan. Palmer Township's population, as of 2018, was estimated at 21,463. Palmer Township strives to lead on environmental and many regional issues thus attempting to preserve and protect natural resources such as the area's tributaries: Schoeneck and Bushkill Creeks, and the Lehigh River, all which flow into the Delaware River. The Delaware River upstream of the tributaries' confluences with the Delaware River, is the source of our drinking water for most Township residents and businesses.



We hope you will consider and incorporate on your property some of the below listed sustainable practices in order to retain and sustain these water resources as our community grows. Each of us should strive to be the best stewards of these resources for not only ourselves, but for our children, and our children!

As a Palmer resident and/or business owner your compliance with the MS4 Ordinance will assist in our objective so that our aquatic environment is not adversely impacted. What can each of us do to help? For starters, review the above Township Ordinance and Quick Resource Guide for suggested plantings, reduction of impervious surfaces and retention of stormwater on your property and safe discharge of runoff waters. Some active steps you can take to improve aesthetic value while reducing impervious surfaces are:

Green Infrastructure (GI) - Reduces and mitigates stormwater impacts at its source while delivering environmental safeguards. A BMP "Best Management Practices" describes measures taken to control stormwater caused by changes to land use via development resulting in increased impervious surfaces. BMP describes



resources and practices on how to protect and utilize natural flow pathways in overall stormwater planning and design to minimizes stormwater impacts associated with site development. Protecting natural drainage features such as swales, depressions, and ephemeral streams during site development can provide a variety of stormwater management functions.



Wet Ponds (WPs), also called Retention Basins, are stormwater basins that include a permanent pool of water as well as additional capacity for temporary storage of stormwater. They are effective at controlling peak stormwater rates and improving stormwater quality. For a prime example of a Wet Pond walk the Easton Area High School property (Kunkle Tract) between South Greenwood Ave., Route 22 and Milford St.

Rain Gardens are excavated shallow depressions, planted with native vegetation that can withstand dry and wet periods. Stormwater is collected in the rain garden and is both infiltrated into the ground and evapotranspirated by the vegetation.

Storm Drain Protection – remove litter, debris, and grass clipping from the street in front of your property.

 - **1 Penn Pump Pavilion Permit** **Not to exceed 150 people.* Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
 - **2 Penn Pump Picnic Permit** *Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people.

Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion.





When is a Permit Required?

The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code, as well as, the ordinances of Palmer Township require permits for many types of projects. Activities requiring permits include:



- Any structural change/alteration
- Plumbing
- Electrical
- Mechanical/HVAC (new and replacement)
- · Re-roofing
- Replacement windows
- Replacement siding
- Decks

- Driveways (replacement, expansion and resurface)
- Signs (except political signs) and banners
- Additional living space conversions
- Patios and patio roofs
- Fences (temporary and permanent)
- Retaining walls
- Sheds and carports (accessory structures)

Building code regulations require minimum standards for design and construction to ensure the safety and welfare of the occupants. The above list may not include all necessary permits. You may contact the Permit Department at (610) 253-7191 for more information.

Clearance of Snow from Public Sidewalks

Please remember that all snow, ice, or sleet shall be removed from all public sidewalks abutting your property within 12 hours after the snow has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon. This includes the accessibility ramps located at street intersections. Whenever it may be impossible to remove all snow, sleet, or ice, which may have become compacted by travel or formed on sidewalks so as to present a slippery surface, ashes, cinders, sand or any other suitable substance shall be applied as to facilitate safe walking upon the sidewalks.

Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.

§109-3(SS) - **Depositing snow prohibited:** No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner, deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire hydrant or privately owned property without the permission



from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.

Pennsylvania's Green Amendment

Article 1, Section 27 of Pennsylvania's constitution states that "The people have a right to clean air, pure water, and to the preservation of the natural, scenic, historic and esthetic values of the environment. Pennsylvania's public natural resources are the common property of all the people, including generations yet to come." We are one of only 2 states in the U.S.—Montana being the other one—that include this in their constitution. It is not a new idea either; it was adopted in 1971 during a time of great environmental concern strongly shared across the political aisle.

Upholding Pennsylvania's constitution—one of the chief ways we can help protect and support our fellow residents—is our duty. That includes tackling issues that most people might not realize or think is impacting them, such as problems in policy adopted outside of each person's respective communities. We might say in some cases that the world is full of metaphorical islands, as in diplomacy, but where environmental issues are concerned ultimately no country is truly an island. The policies we adopt in one place necessarily impact people in another, and likewise our attempts in Pennsylvania to guarantee "clean air, pure water, and the preservation of the natural, scenic, historic and esthetic values of the environment" are impacted by the actions taken by others outside of our communities, our commonwealth, and eventually the wider world. As such, it is the responsibility of all members of Palmer, Northampton County, the Lehigh Valley, and Pennsylvania (and, not to forget, the country and the World) to make sure that, in our attempts to achieve the goals and standards outlined in our constitution(s), we keep an eye on situations both near and far.
