


# **Business, Industrial and Professional Association of Palmer Township News**

The alliance formed between the business community and the township is evident in the projects the BIP has initiated and helped bring to fruition. The funds for these projects have been raised by the members of the BIP. For example, the Association was instrumental in the construction of the Palmer Branch of the Easton Area Public Library and has collected and donated thousands of dollars in books and equipment to the Branch. BIP was also in the forefront of advocating the construction of the Palmer Branch of the United States Post Office at its Greenwood Avenue location. The Welcome to Palmer Township signs located at entrances to the township and the landscaping at the entrances/exits to Route 22 have been funded by the BIP.

Since 2005 the BIP has given approximately \$320,000 back to the township in community projects that it has funded. These projects include:

- Contributed \$26,000 to the building of the Charles Chrin Community Center of Palmer Township.
- Donated \$6,000 to the floor lining project at the Community Center.
- The BIP was the driving force in providing the community information sign at Northampton and 25th Streets. This was a partnership between the BIP, Lions Club of Palmer Township and Palmer Township.
- The BIP funded the playground constructed at the Community Center.
- The pavilion at the Community Center was funded and built by the BIP.
- The BIP donated \$35,000 to the Miracle League of Northampton County who built a special regional baseball field for children with intellectual and physical disabilities at the Community Center.



- The pavilion at the Palmer Pool was funded by the BIP.
- The landscaping and benches in front of the Palmer Memorial Library were funded and the project was managed by the BIP.

The BIP is excited to announce our most recent community projects:

- The addition of illuminated bike path crossing signs on Greenwood Avenue by the Palmer Township Post Office.
- Contributing \$100,000 toward the new Palmer Township Kiwanis Youth Center Project located at 3052 Green Pond Road. This building will replace the existing building that was built in the 1960's and has outlived its useful life.



Each year since 2005 the BIP has held an annual Golf Outing to raise money that is used to help fund these community projects. The most recent outing was held on Monday September 20, 2021, at the Riverview Country Club.

The members of the BIP are proud of what it has been able to do in giving back to our community.

The Palmer Recovery Center's mission is to provide a safe, sober, and supportive space for those in all stages of recovery. The recovery center is a partnership with the Northampton County Human Services Drug and Alcohol Division and Guided Pathways, Inc.

Services provided include: drug and alcohol assessments and referral to treatment, case management and CRS services, recovery based meetings, computers-printers and phones for job searches and resume preparation, job fairs, psycho-education courses, and resume and legal clinics. Services are all provided in a safe, sober and relaxing atmosphere.

The center also provides a Veterans Recovery Drop-In Program every Friday from 9 AM to 4 PM, partnered with BattleBorne. It offers services such as: peer support groups, professional support groups/MST, job/resume assistance, legal clinics, training, VA benefit assistance, on-site drug and alcohol assessments/referrals to treatment and on-site certified recovery specialists.


#### Fees:

- Penn Pump There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm
  - 1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit \*Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. Palmer Residents \$100.00
  - 2. Penn Pump Picnic Permit \*Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people.
    - Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. Palmer Residents \$50.00
- Riverview Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8am–10:00pm Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8am 10pm Palmer Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00 \*Briarcliffe is unavailable for rent on weekends from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

- Caregivers can receive reimbursement for approved, out-of-pocket caregiving expenses such as respite care, assistance with personal care and consumable supplies such as adult disposable depends and nutritional drink supplements.
- Care receiver is age 60 or older and requires assistance with bathing dressing etc., or under age 60 with a diagnosis of dementia
- Reimbursement is based on the household income of the care receiver
  - Assistance for Grandparents who are 55+ and are the primary caregiver for their grandchildren
    - Assistance for older adults who are 55+ and are the primary caregiver for their adult children age 18-59 with a diagnosis of a non-dementia related disability.





### Today's Palmer

#### STORMWATER AND WHAT IT MEANS TO YOU



The Federal Clean Water Act (CWA) prohibits the discharge of pollutants into waterways. Pennsylvania's Stormwater Management Act (Act 167) MS4 Program governs how Palmer Township must deal with stormwater runoff.

Palmer Township has a Stormwater System – separate from its Sewerage System. The Sewerage System carries "gray water" to the sewerage treatment plant on Route 611. **The Stormwater system drains directly into either the Bushkill Creek or the Lehigh River.** 

The above drawing depicts what goes into the stormwater system and how it impacts our waterways and their inhabitants. Our rivers and streams flow directly into the Atlantic Ocean. The pollutants that we put in our stormwater system adversely impact our oceans, fisheries and ultimately our weather! Do you enjoy going to the Maryland or New Jersey shore and finding plastics, paper and other consumer products on the beach and in the water you are swimming in? You do know where it all comes from!

We all care about Clean Water, and we all play a major role in keeping it clean! Polls consistently show that CLEAN WATER is amongst people's biggest concerns. The largest cause of water quality problems is nonpoint source pollution, which comes from various polluting activities on the land. With more frequent "100-year storms," improving stormwater management has become a front-burner issue due to a desire to mitigate runoff related problems before they occur.

What can you do to assist? You can start by simple acts such as: Use of a rain barrel to water your garden and shrubs. Develop a rain garden in your yard. Never dump anything down storm drains or in ditches. Many people wrongly think that storm drains are part of a sanitary sewer system that flow to a wastewater treatment facility. **Adopt a storm drain** via removing all debris clogging the drain thus preventing flooded streets, cars and basements.







### Are you familiar with the FDNY Stephen Siller story?

On September 11, Stephen, who was assigned to Brooklyn's Squad 1, had just finished his shift and was on his way to play golf with his brothers when he got word of a plane



hitting the North Tower of the World Trade Center. He returned to Squad 1 to get his gear. Stephen drove his truck to the entrance of the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel, but it had already been closed. He strapped 60 lbs. of gear to his back and raced on foot through the tunnel to the Twin Towers, where he gave up his life while saving others.


Stephens brothers created the foundation named Tunnel to Towers, which raises money to assist in building homes for 9/11

#### When is a Permit Required?

The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code, as well as, the ordinances of Palmer Township require permits for many types of projects. Activities requiring permits include:



- Any structural change/ alteration
- Plumbing
- Electrical
- Mechanical/HVAC (new and replacement)
- · Re-roofing
- Replacement windows

- Replacement siding
- Decks
- Pools (permanent/ temporary and replacement)
- Finished basements
- Driveways (replacement, expansion and resurface)
- Signs (except political signs) and banners
- Additional living space conversions
- Patios and patio roofs
- Fences (temporary and permanent)

Building code regulations require minimum standards for design and construction to ensure the safety and welfare of the occupants. The above list may not include all necessary permits. You may contact the Permit Department at (610) 253-7191 for more information.

#### Clearance of Snow from Public Sidewalks



Please remember that all snow, ice, or sleet shall be removed from all public sidewalks abutting your property within 12 hours after the snow has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon. This includes the accessibility ramps located at street intersections. Whenever it may be impossible to remove all snow, sleet, or ice, which may have become

compacted by travel or formed on sidewalks so as to present a slippery surface, ashes, cinders, sand or any other suitable substance shall be applied as to facilitate safe walking upon the sidewalks.

Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.

§109-3(SS) - Depositing snow prohibited: No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner, deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire hydrant or privately owned property without the permission from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.





#### **CURBSIDE RECYCLING**

#### All carts should be placed curbside by 5:00am.

**PAPER** – office and school paper, newsprint, junk mail, paper bags, phone books, magazines, catalogs, envelopes, wrapping paper (no metallic paper or bows.) Shredded paper should be bagged and placed in the trash cart.

**CARDBOARD** – corrugated cardboard, paper towels rolls, and shipping, shoe, gift, and food boxes. No waxed coated boxes (i.e. frozen food boxes) or cardboard contaminated with food, paint or oil. Flatten or cut up for easy release from cart.

**PLASTIC BOTTLES OR CONTAINERS** – Rinsed household containers and bottles (such as soda, water, milk, juice, shampoo, detergent, condiments, yogurt, margarine, to-go containers, pet food, etc.) No Styrofoam. Look for the recycling triangle on the bottom with these numbers inside #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, and #7. Lids attached.

**NEW IN 2021 FLEXIBLE (NOT RIGID) PLASTICS** – these are <u>able to flex or wrap and are rinsed clean of food contamination</u>. Acceptable items include, plastic shopping bags, potato, chocolate chip and snack bags, produce bags including salad, grapes, and carrot bags, shredded cheese packages, pet treat pouches, case wrap, shrink film, bread bags, bubble wrap, cereal bags, drink and juice pouches, paper towel and toilet paper overwraps, detergent pouches, shipping bags.

**GLASS** - Rinsed clear, brown, and green bottles and jars. Discard lids.

**CANS** – Rinsed aluminum, bi-metal, and tin cans as well as empty aerosol cans.

#### **METAL POTS AND PANS**

**CARTONS** – Rinsed food cartons that contain milk, juice, broth, cream, egg substitutes, soup, soy milk, and wine boxes.

NO food contaminated items, electronics, textiles, construction debris, or yard waste.

#### **HOLIDAY COLLECTIONS**

There will no collection on Thanksgiving and collection will be delayed by one day following this holiday.

#### **CURBSIDE TRASH**

- All trash goes into your green cart with the green lid. Materials outside the cart will not be collected.
- Bag trash to help keep your cart clean and reduce windblown litter.
- Prohibited items include recyclables, tires, hazardous waste, liquid paint, electronics, yard waste, construction debris, dirt, rock, and car parts.

Overfilled carts or carts containing prohibited items will not be collected.

#### **UPCOMING SPECIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTIONS**

Place curbside on your scheduled collection day, but will be collected that week by a separate vehicle.

#### **Bulk Item Collections - Week of November 29**

During the quarterly (4x per year) Bulk Item collections, on their regularly scheduled collection day, residents can put out one bulk item for collection. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the curbside trash cart. Examples of bulk items include, but are not limited to furniture, tables, chairs, sofas, mattresses, rolled up and tied area rugs (no larger than 2' x 5'), bicycles, etc. No hazardous waste, electronics, construction debris, yard waste, or additional household trash is acceptable as part of these Bulk Item collections.

Additional items, above and beyond the one allowed item, can be placed curbside for collection during this week, **only if previously arranged and paid for by calling Waste Management at 800-621-2100 ahead of time.** Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township to get the reduced price of \$40 per item. Be sure to get a confirmation number.

#### **Yard Waste Collection** – Week of November 8

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, and garden clippings) will be collected curbside. Place your yard waste in any clean, open-top container (not in your automated carts), tie with cotton or hemp twine, bundle no larger than 3' x 3'x 3", and weighing no more than 40 lbs., or place in compostable paper bags.

NO plastic rope, bags, or twine, grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, or any wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter, animal excrement, noxious weeds, or bamboo of any kind or soil.

#### Leaf Collection – Eight weeks in the fall

Residents must rake their leaves into the street and close to the curb. This collection is highly dependent on weather conditions.

### Christmas Tree Collection – First three (3) full weeks in January

Remove any transport bags, tinsel, ornaments, lights, and tree stands.

#### Pennsylvania and Palmer Business Recycling Requirements:

The Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act of 1988 (Act 101) requires commercial, institutional, and municipal establishments located in Pennsylvania's mandated municipalities to recycle office paper, corrugated paper and cardboard, newsprint, plastics, steel, aluminum, and bimetallic cans, glass, and leaf waste.

### Recycling Reporting and Documentation must be provided to Palmer Township Annually

Pennsylvania also requires that all commercial, institutional and municipal entities must provide written documentation as to the type and weight of materials recycled annually. Reports are due to Palmer Township by January 30th of each year on a form provided by the Township.


