

Mill Race Park Ecological Filter – MS4 Best Management Practice



Mill Race Park is not just a family friendly outdoor recreation space, it is also home to Palmer Township's first ecological stormwater filter. The ecological filter is located to the North of Bushkill Creek and to the East of Newlins Mill Road. Some may think nature is taking its' course, but this basin was designed to have all the native plants growing along the basin bottom.

All the native plant species, as well as rock structures in the basin bottom, aid in filtering stormwater naturally before it enters the Bushkill Creek. Plant roots grab nutrients from water to use for growth, and rocks create spaces for any sediment or debris to fall into, so it is removed from the stormwater.

Since the ecological filter is heavily reliant on the use of native plants for filtering stormwater, there are strict instructions for how species were originally planted, and how they need to be maintained. There is absolutely no fertilizer of any kind allowed near the plants in the detention basin. If any trees along the berm, or raised edge, of the basin should die, they need to be replaced by the same species. Grasses need to be mowed during the growing season except for the designated "no-mow" areas along the Bushkill Creek shore. Native plants in the basin even need to be watered if there is an extended dry period.

Plants are also used to maintain other aspects of the basin. For example, if there is erosion in the ecological filter the maintenance instructions dictate to plant more native grass to cover it. Planting grass to cover erosion makes sense because all the roots that anchor grass to the soil also keep soil from washing away during heavy rainfall.

The last line of defense, in case the system is overwhelmed by water, is called the emergency spillway (pictured above). The rocks in this rip-rap have the same function as those in the basin bottom, to filter any unwanted material from the stormwater before it reaches the Bushkill Creek. This rip-rap must be checked annually to make sure it is still intact and functioning properly.

Each aspect of this ecological filter must work in unison with the others to properly filter stormwater and protect our waterways from pollutants. When one part of the basin is not functioning properly the whole system is thrown off. That is why maintaining plant growth in the ecological filter is crucial. 

It is the Parks & Recreation Department's goal to provide citizens with a safe environment in which recreational opportunity can be maximized. Due to the wide variety of patron needs and use of Township property, it is necessary to establish the following rules and regulations.

Event representative must have permit with them for duration of the event.

Reservations: Will be available to Palmer residents only for the month of January, beginning on January 4th, 2021 at 9:00am. Park rentals will become available to the general public on February 1st, 2021 at 9:00am. All reservations must be completed in person at the

Fees:

- Penn Pump There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00am–10:00pm
- 1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit *Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. Residents \$100.00
- 1. <u>Penn Pump Picnic Permit</u> *Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people.

Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. Residents \$50.00

• **Riverview**- Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00

• **BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race** – Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00

*Briarcliffe is unavailable for rent on weekends from Memorial Day to Labor Day





What is a watershed? What is my place in it? What does it matter to me?

A watershed is all the land area that is drained by a stream. Whatever is uphill flows downhill! We all live downstream!

The map on the adjacent page outlines our three (3) watersheds and drain basins for each of the waterways impacted by Palmer Township. Which watershed does your residence impact?

We are all stewards of our environment. Through proper land management, greenway preservation and proper stormwater detention, retention and drainage, coupled with prevention of and removal of all roadside litter, will ensure that we live, work and play in a healthy environment within our community.

When it rains some water seeps into the ground, a lot of water flows off the land. Whatever is on the land, asphalt (oils), concrete (lime) and even our lawns (fertilizers, pesticides) ultimately washes into the stream. That means that anything and everything can, and does, wash into our waterways!

As Palmer residents we are part of the Bushkill Creek watershed that is approximately an 80 mi.² area originating at the base of the Pocono Mountains. Our watershed contains many natural features such as wetlands, bogs, fish habitat, plant and animal breeding grounds as well as scenic and recreational areas. Most important to our human population though, is the fact that the Bushkill Creek and other streams are part of a greater watershed, the Delaware River.

Did you know that our drinking water is sourced from the Delaware River?

Remember anything that washes into the creeks, streams and rivers may ultimately need to be removed from the waterways before it becomes your drinking water. We need to be watchful and diligent as stewards of our environment to not only monitor the quantity of stormwater that flows to our streams but also the quality of the water flowing into the receiving waterways. Our waterways are monitored for macro invertebrates. Their existence is a sign of water quality and are a food source for our native fish. Simple things a resident can do immediately is:

1. Adopt a nearby storm drain and remove litter.


- 2. Reduce chemical use on your property and always follow the instructions for application recommended by the manufacturer.
- 3. Limit or reduce runoff from your property.
- 4. Use a rain barrel.
- 5. Make a rain garden.
- 6. Make your yard more habitat friendly such as looking at information from the National Wildlife Federation. You may also contact the local Soil Conservation District, Palmer Township's Environmental Steering Committee, Pennsylvania Master Gardener Coordinator or the Bushkill Stream Conservancy. (To contact any or all of the above listed entities, Google search their name and their website will quickly appear.)

- 7. Plant native trees that will offer shade to your house (reduce cooling costs) as well as provide oxygen and filter stormwater thus improving our environment.
- 8. Growing house plants, especially during winter, helps to purify and improve the quality of air in your home.

Planting of non-invasive plants will help to filter stormwater, preserves your soil, is a natural habitat for any number of insects (a lot of them are good) and animals, as each blossoms they will enhance the beauty of your property.

Future articles will address more of these concerns and specifically, the Historical, Recreational and Biological aspects of our waterways and how each of us is responsible to ensure that we do not deposit harmful chemicals, oils, detergents, roadside litter and other materials, all of which ultimately finds their way into our waterways.





CURBSIDE RECYCLING

All carts should be placed curbside by 5:00am. Materials placed outside of the carts will not be collected. Lids need to be closed and not overflowing to prevent litter and cart lid breakage.

PAPER – office and school paper, newsprint, junk mail, paper bags, phone books, magazines, catalogs, envelopes, wrapping paper (no metallic paper or bows.) Shredded paper should be bagged and placed in the trash cart.

CARDBOARD – corrugated cardboard, paper towels rolls, and shipping, shoe, gift, and food boxes. No waxed coated boxes (i.e. frozen food boxes) or cardboard contaminated with food, paint or oil. Flatten or cut up for easy release from cart.

PLASTIC BOTTLES OR CONTAINERS – Rinsed household containers and bottles (such as soda, water, milk, juice, shampoo, detergent, condiments, yogurt, margarine, to-go containers, pet food, etc.) No Styrofoam. Look for the recycling triangle on the bottom with these numbers inside #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, and #7. Lids attached.

FLEXIBLE (NOT RIGID) PLASTICS – these are <u>able to flex or wrap and are rinsed clean of food</u> <u>contamination</u>. Acceptable items include, plastic shopping bags, potato, chocolate chip and snack bags, produce bags including salad, grapes, and carrot bags, shredded cheese packages, pet treat pouches, case wrap, shrink film, bread bags, bubble wrap, cereal bags, drink and juice pouches, paper towel and toilet paper overwraps, detergent pouches, shipping bags.

GLASS - Rinsed clear, brown, and green bottles and jars. Discard lids.

CANS – Rinsed aluminum, bi-metal, and tin cans as well as empty aerosol cans.

METAL POTS AND PANS

CARTONS – Rinsed food cartons that contain milk, juice, broth, cream, egg substitutes, soup, soy milk, and wine boxes.

NO food contaminated items, electronics, textiles, construction debris, or yard waste.

RECYCLING DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Hartley Avenue Recycling Center

Monday, Wednesday, Friday: 12pm – 4pm Saturday: 10-3pm Sunday: 12pm-4pm Yard Waste

Accepts paper, cardboard, plastic bottles and containers, glass, cans, scrap metals, and yard waste (no more than 3 small bundles of yard waste (no larger than 1' high by 3' long and not exceeding 40 lbs.) per visit). Free to Palmer residents and businesses.

Berks Street Yard Waste Composting

Center – Open to Palmer Residents and

Businesses Only

Accepts large amounts of yard waste for a small fee. NO plastic rope, bags, or twine, grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, or any wood or tree limbs over twelve (12) inches in diameter, animal excrement, noxious weeds, or bamboo of any kind or soil.

For the safety of the attendants, residents, and township employees, the speed limit of 5 MPH must be adhered to from the time you enter the center gate until you leave.

2022 HOLIDAY COLLECTIONS

There will be no collection on Labor Day or Thanksgiving. Collections will be delayed by one day following these holidays.

CURBSIDE TRASH

- All trash goes into your green cart with the green lid. Materials outside the cart will not be collected.
- Trash should be bagged before being placed in the cart. Bagging helps keep your cart clean and reduces windblown litter.
- Prohibited items include recyclables, tires, hazardous waste, liquid paint, motor oil, electronics, yard waste, construction debris (wood, concrete, window panes, etc.), dirt, rock, car parts and fireworks and fire pit debris that has not been thoroughly soaked with water prior to being placed in the cart..

Overfilled carts or carts containing prohibited items will not be collected.

UPCOMING SPECIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTIONS Place curbside on your scheduled collection day, but will be collected that week by a separate vehicle.

BULK ITEM COLLECTIONS - Weeks of September 12 and November 28

During the quarterly (4x per year) Bulk Item collections, on their regularly scheduled collection day, residents can put out one bulk item for collection. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the curbside trash cart, no larger than a standard sofa, and capable of being lifted and moved by 2 men. Examples of bulk items include, but are not limited to furniture, tables, chairs, sofas, mattresses, area rugs rolled up and tied (no larger than 2'x 5'), etc. No hazardous waste, electronics, construction debris, yard waste, or additional household trash is acceptable as part of these Bulk Item collections.

Additional items, above and beyond the one allowed item, can be placed curbside for collection during this week, only if previously arranged and paid for by calling Waste Management at 800-621-2100 ahead of time. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township to get the reduced price of \$40 per item. Be sure to get a confirmation number.

METAL AND APPLIANCES COLLECTION – Week of September 26

Includes all major appliances, such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, (Freon no longer needs to be removed) stoves, dishwashers (metal only, not plastic), hot water tanks, and trash compactors, BBQ grills and push-behind lawnmowers (gas, charcoal, oil removed), bicycles, swing sets if taken apart and bundled (no larger than 2' x 5") and other items of similar weight, material, size.

These items can also be taken to the Hartley Avenue Recycling Center.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION – Week of November 7

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, and garden clippings) will be collected curbside. Place your yard waste in any clean, open-top container (not in your automated carts), tie with cotton or hemp twine, bundle no larger than 3'x 3'x 3", and weighing no more than 40 lbs., or place in compostable paper bags. No grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, wood or tree limbs over four inches in diameter; human or animal excrement; noxious weeks, bamboo, or soil contaminated with hazardous substance.

NO plastic rope, bags, or twine, grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, or any wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter, animal excrement, noxious weeds, or bamboo of any kind or soil.

LEAF COLLECTION – Eight weeks in the fall

Residents must rake their leaves into the street and close to the curb. This collection is highly dependent on weather conditions.

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION – *First three* (3) *full weeks in January* Remove any transport bags, tinsel, ornaments, lights, and tree stands.


