

MS4 BMP - Water Quality Inlet



There are many ways that townships and municipalities all over the country have adapted their practices to reduce stormwater pollution. The concepts are the same: reduce waste and keep pollutants out of the water ways, but how this is accomplished is unique to every region. In past articles other best management practices (BMPs) were described such as the ecological filter at Mill Race Park and the wash bays at the Public Works building. Palmer has another BMP that may be on your street! These BMPs are water quality inlets, called SNOUTS, that can be added to storm drain inlets with sumps to reduce the amount and number of pollutants discharged from the stormwater system.

A SNOUT is a vented fiberglass water quality hood that is installed over the outflow pipe in a storm drain with a deep sump or drain. The hood creates space to trap any floating debris on the surface and allows solids to sink to

the bottom of the sump. The drain or sump needs to be deep, at a minimum


36 inches, to allow separation of floating debris, sediment, and oil. The outflow pipe of the SNOUT is designed to keep solids and trash inside the drain and prevent them from washing further into the storm drain system. The clarified water is then forced out of the SNOUT by incoming storm flow resulting in a cleaner stormwater discharge with none or reduced amounts of sediment, oils, and trash.

While these SNOUTs help keep trash and sediment out of the water ways, it is still important to reduce your stormwater pollution at home. Fees:

- Penn Pump There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm
 - 1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit *Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. Palmer Residents \$100.00
 - **2 . Penn Pump Picnic Permit** *Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people.
 - Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. Palmer Residents \$50.00
- Riverview Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8:00am–10:00pm Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8:00am–10:00pm Palmer Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00 *Briarcliffe is unavailable for rent on weekends from Memorial Day to Labor Day.




Palmer Township Athletic Association Christmas Tree Sale







Fire Zones

Our Officers are continuing to patrol upon vehicles double parking in fire zones in our shopping center parking lots. Fire Zones are marked with signs and painted markings on the ground, that designate the areas vehicles may NOT park. If a vehicle is parked in a fire zone, at any time, they can be cited and risk having their vehicle towed. Please do not park in fire zones, it is a public safety issue in the event of an emergency.





When is a Permit Required?

The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code, as well as, the ordinances of Palmer Township require permits for many types of projects. Activities requiring permits include:



- Any structural change/alteration
- Plumbing
- Electrical
- Mechanical/HVAC (new and replacement)
- · Re-roofing
- Replacement windows
- · Replacement siding
- Decks
- Pools (permanent/temporary and replacement)
- · Finished basements

- Driveways (replacement, expansion and resurface)
- Signs (except political signs) and banners
- · Additional living space conversions
- Patios and patio roofs
- Fences (temporary and permanent)
- Retaining walls
- Sheds and carports (accessory structures)

Building code regulations require minimum standards for design and construction to ensure the safety and welfare of the occupants. The above list may not include all necessary permits. You may contact the Permit Department at (610) 253-7191 for more information.

Clearance of Snow from Public Sidewalks

Please remember that all snow, ice, or sleet shall be removed from all public sidewalks abutting your property within 12 hours after the snow has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon. This includes the accessibility ramps located at street intersections. Whenever it may be impossible to remove all snow, sleet, or ice, which may have become compacted by travel or formed on sidewalks so as to present a slippery surface, ashes, cinders, sand or any other suitable substance shall be applied as to facilitate safe walking upon the sidewalks.

Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.

§109-3(SS) - **Depositing snow prohibited:** No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner, deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire hydrant or privately owned property without the permission from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.





Ordinance §138-3

Ordinance §138-3 has been revised to reflect the following approved locations for storage of garbage & recycling containers on residential properties:

Except for days on which refuse is being collected, all refuse containers must be kept to the side or rear of the premises. Municipal waste containers shall not be stored on front porches or within 3-feet of the front door. Exceptions:

- (a) In High Density Residential areas, as defined in Chapter 190, containers may be kept along the front of the house or structure. A natural or manmade screen is encouraged. Manmade screens shall be accordance with the requirements of Chapter 190.
- (b) For single-family attached and semi-detached homes, containers may be kept along the front of the house or structure, upon request and approval by the Board of Supervisors, provided that such containers are obscured from view from the public street by a natural or manmade screen and located and a minimum of 5-feet from property lines. Manmade screens shall be accordance with the requirements of Chapter 190.
- (c) Where a waiver is obtained, by the Board of Supervisors, due to the infeasibility by topographic constraints or disability limitations.
- (d) For residents that are approved for and utilize the Township's assisted collection program provided by the contracted hauler.

Palmer Community Weekend 2022 is in the books. The staff of PMFD are beyond grateful to our community and visitors who supported us throughout the festivities. Our proceeds, to include your generous donations will continue to help us with events we provide to the community throughout the year, such as our open house and Santa Run to name a few.



Subject: Watershed series, Part 2: Recreation

Last quarter we published the first of four articles on Watersheds in our community with the initial focus being on:

What is a watershed?
What is my place in it?
What does it matter to me?

As noted in last quarter's article; watersheds are comprised of both small and large tributaries feeding into main water sources in our areas, distinctly the Lehigh and Delaware Rivers. All watersheds, both large and small, play a vital role in our ecosystems. In part 2 of our series, we will focus on the recreation benefits living in a community surrounded by multiple watersheds, specifically the Bushkill Creek.

The beautiful Bushkill Creek is a 22.1 mile long tributary of the Delaware River originating at Kittatinny Ridge (Blue Mountain) and ultimately flowing into the Delaware River by the City of Easton. It is considered crystal clear high quality water and a prized creek for fly fishing and Rainbow, Brown and Brook Trout fishing. If you're new to fishing; don't hesitate to contact the folks at Trout Unlimited Forks of the Delaware Chapter 482. In addition to fishing, Trout Unlimited is also very active in providing education and environmental cleanups along the Bushkill.

Along the way, there are many wonderful sites and activities to enjoy including Jacobsburg Environmental Education Center and numerous natural habitats, wildlife and flora to name a few. In Palmer Township, and neighboring townships, activities abound both in the river and along the creek banks.

Mill Race Park and Penn Pump Park are located along the Bushkill Creek providing picnicking, restrooms, playground equipment and sports fields (including a pickleball court at Mill Race Park). Riverview Park along the Lehigh River also has many things to do including a handicap accessible fishing pier and fish ladder by Chain Dam, a short walk down the paved bike path.

Interconnecting several of Palmer Townships wonderful parks, is our renowned Palmer Township Recreation Trail which also goes by several other names: Two Rivers Trail, TowPath Bike Trail, Palmer TWP Rail Trail and the D&L Trail because it merges with the Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor.

The Palmer Township Recreation Trail is a terrific community asset for Palmer and surrounding townships, for city residents, and a great destination for visitors. For history and train buffs, three modes of transportation actually once operated on this corridor: Lehigh Canal, the Central Railroad of New Jersey, and the Lehigh Valley Transit (LVT) interurban. The eight-foot-wide asphalt trail head starts near the Easton Area High School and traverses a variety of landscapes including forests, farmland, residential neighborhoods, and the banks of the Bushkill Creek and Lehigh River. Thanks to on-going funding and continual improvements; the Palmer Trail (Palmer Trail map below) is now linked with various other trails. Visit the Delaware & Lehigh Heritage Corridor website for trail maps and a new interactive map to help navigate additional trails: https://delawareandlehigh.org. There is even a link on trail etiquette to ensure the safety of everyone.


Regardless if you're a walker or biker, make sure to stop and enjoy all the diverse habitats attracting a large variety of bird species throughout the year. According to the Bushkill Stream Conservancy, a public-private partnership advancing the conservation and enhancement of the Bushkill Creek watershed, over 246 species of birds have been recorded in the Bushkill Creek Watershed. CURBSIDE RECYCLING

All carts should be placed curbside by 5:00am. Materials placed outside of the carts will not be collected. Lids need to be closed and not overflowing to prevent litter and cart lid breakage.



CARDBOARD – paper towel rolls, cereal, cracker, and pasta boxes, shipping and shoe boxes, manila folders, etc. No wax-coated, pizza or other food, paint or oil contaminated boxes. Flatten and/or cut up to release from the cart easily.

PLASTIC BOTTLES OR CONTAINERS – Rinsed household tubs and bottles (such as soda, water, milk, juice, shampoo, detergent, condiments, yogurt, margarine, to-go containers, pet food, etc.) No plastic bags or Styrofoam. Look for the recycling triangle on the bottom with these numbers inside #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, #7. Lids attached.

FLEXIBLE (NOT RIGID) PLASTICS – these are <u>able to flex or wrap and are rinsed clean of food contamination</u>. Acceptable items include plastic shopping bags, potato chip and snack bags, produce bags including salad and carrot bags, shredded cheese packages, pet treat pouches, case wrap, shrink film, bread bags, bubble wrap, cereal bags, drink pouches, paper towel and toilet paper overwraps, detergent pouches, shipping bags.

GLASS - Rinsed clear, brown, and green bottles and jars. Discard lids.

CANS – Rinsed aluminum, bi-metal, and tin cans as well as empty aerosol cans.

METAL POTS AND PANS

CARTONS – Rinsed food cartons that contain milk, juice, broth, cream, egg substitutes, soup, soy milk, and wine boxes.

No food contaminated items, electronics, textiles, construction debris, or yard waste.

2022 HOLIDAY COLLECTIONS

There will be no collection on Thanksgiving. Collections will be delayed by one day following this holiday.

CURBSIDE TRASH

- All trash goes into your green cart with the green lid. Materials outside the cart will not be collected.
- Trash should be bagged before being placed in the cart. Bagging helps keep your cart clean and reduces windblown litter.
- <u>Prohibited items include recyclables</u> (see left), tires, hazardous waste, liquid paint, motor oil, electronics, yard waste, construction debris (wood, concrete, window panes, etc.), dirt, rock, and car parts.
- Overfilled carts or carts containing prohibited items will not be collected.

Berks Street Yard Waste Composting Center

Berks Yard Waste Center will be open the first Sunday of the month in December, January and February.

Accepts large amounts of yard waste for a small fee. NO plastic rope, bags, or twine; grass clippings, tree stumps, soil or dirt, sod, wood, animal excrement, or noxious weeds including bamboo of any kind. Tree limbs must be less than 12" inches in diameter.

Speed limit within the center is 5 MPH at all times.

UPCOMING SPECIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTIONS

Place curbside on your scheduled collection day, but will be collected that *week* by a separate vehicle.

BULK ITEM COLLECTIONS - WEEK OF NOVEMBER 28

During the quarterly (4x per year) Bulk Item collections, on their regularly scheduled collection day, residents can put out one bulk item for collection. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the curbside trash cart, no larger than a standard sofa, and capable of being lifted and moved by 2 men. Examples of bulk items include, but are not limited to furniture, tables, chairs, sofas, mattresses or box spring (must be wrapped in plastic), area rugs rolled up and tied (no larger than 2' x 5'), etc. No hazardous waste, electronics, construction debris, yard waste, or additional household trash is acceptable as part of these Bulk Item collections.

Additional items can be placed curbside during these weeks or any week, only if previously arranged and paid for by calling Waste Management at 800-621-2100, the week prior. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township to get the reduced price of \$40 per item. Be sure to get a confirmation number.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION - WEEK OF NOVEMBER 7

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, and garden clippings) will be collected curbside. Tree limbs must be less than 4" inches in diameter.

NO plastic rope, bags, or twine, grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, or any wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter, animal excrement, noxious weeds, or bamboo of any kind or soil.

LEAF COLLECTION - EIGHT WEEKS IN THE FALL

Residents must rake their leaves into the street and close to the curb. This collection is highly dependent on weather conditions.

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION - FIRST THREE (3) FULL WEEKS IN JANUARY

Remove any transport bags, tinsel, ornaments, lights, and tree stands.
