

### **HAVE BAMBOO?**

Per the Township Bamboo Ordinance (Chapter 187), it has been determined that planting, cultivating, and growing bamboo has a negative impact on the health, safety, and welfare of the public at large and must be controlled. For specific instructions on how to control bamboo, refer to Ordinance Chapter 187 or call the Municipal Building.




The most effective method for bamboo removal is to cut off the canes, dig out the entire root, and dry it for disposal. Residents should bring completely dried roots to the Township Recycling Center located on Hartley Ave.

### **MS4-HISTORY AND REQUIREMENTS**

Most would agree that they want clean water, clean air, and a healthier planet for the next generation, but what are we doing to improve our quality of life in the long-term? While there are many different laws and regulations surrounding pollution and use of environmental resources, one federal program that is actively working to make a difference on the local level is the Municipal Separate Storm



Sewer System (MS4) permit program. Although this permit program is an important step towards working together to keep our environment clean and healthy, the MS4 permit program is an unfunded state and federal mandate with increasing regulations every permit cycle, which is every five years. An unfunded mandate means that municipalities like Palmer Township are required to meet the permit regulations without any funding assistance, otherwise the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will issue a fine for noncompliance.

The US EPA regulates stormwater management through the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program to comply with the Clean Water Act originally passed in 1948. Each individual state administers permits to their municipalities to comply with state-specific requirements for water quality standards. In Pennsylvania, Palmer Township must follow the standards for surface waters described in Chapter 93 of the Pennsylvania Code. The focus of the permit is for municipalities to develop and implement a stormwater management program to educate residents about stormwater issues and reduce pollutants entering the streams and rivers in each municipality. Palmer Township recently renewed its' MS4 permit for another five-year term to remain compliant with the MS4 program and avoid federal fines.

The permit requirements stipulate the minimum control measures, or MCMs, that must be met in each municipalities stormwater program to be compliant with the MS4 permit. These MCMs include public education and outreach, illicit discharge detection and elimination, construction stormwater management, and municipal operations. These MCMs set standards for minimum education requirements, details for erosion control on construction sites, stormwater infrastructure inspections and maintenance, and record



keeping for annual reports and any illicit discharges that may occur in the Township. Through the MS4 program, Palmer Township has been tasked with reducing water pollution within the Township and educating residents on stormwater management, and steps Palmer has taken to improve the MS4 program. Without any additional funds to pay employees, purchase equipment, or perform necessary

maintenance, Palmer decided to form a stormwater authority to fund these mandated projects and pollutant reduction measures. ### CURBSIDE RECYCLING

All carts should be placed curbside by 5:00am. Materials placed outside of the carts will not be collected. Lids need to be closed and not overflowing to prevent litter and cart lid breakage.

**PAPER** – office and school paper, newsprint, junk mail, paper bags, phone books, magazines, catalogs, envelopes, wrapping paper (no metallic paper or bows.) Shredded paper should be bagged and placed in the trash cart.

CARDBOARD - paper towel rolls, cereal, cracker, and pasta boxes, shipping and shoe boxes, manila folders, etc. No wax-coated, pizza or other food, paint or oil contaminated boxes. Flatten and/or cut up to release from the cart easily.

PLASTIC BOTTLES OR CONTAINERS - Rinsed household tubs and bottles (such as soda, water, milk, juice, shampoo, detergent, condiments, vogurt, margarine, to-go containers, pet food, etc.) No plastic bags or Styrofoam. Look for the recycling triangle on the bottom with these numbers inside #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, #7. Lids attached.

FLEXIBLE (NOT RIGID) PLASTICS - these are able to flex or wrap and are rinsed clean of food contamination. Acceptable items include plastic shopping bags, potato chip and snack bags, produce bags including salad and carrot bags, shredded cheese packages, pet treat pouches, case wrap, shrink film, bread bags, bubble wrap, cereal bags, drink pouches, paper towel and toilet paper overwraps, detergent pouches, shipping bags.

GLASS - Rinsed clear, brown, and green bottles and jars. Discard lids.

CANS – Rinsed aluminum, bi-metal, and tin cans as well as empty aerosol cans.

#### **METAL POTS AND PANS**

CARTONS - Rinsed food cartons that contain milk, juice, broth, cream, egg substitutes, soup, soy milk, and wine boxes.

No food contaminated items, electronics, textiles, construction debris, or yard waste.

Accepts paper, cardboard, plastic bottles and containers, glass, cans, scrap metals, and yard waste (no more than 3 small bundles of yard waste (no larger than 3' x 3' and not exceeding 40 lbs.) per visit. Free to Palmer residents and businesses.

#### **Berks Street Yard Waste Composting Center**

December, January and February, First Sunday of the Month, 12:00pm - 4:00pm

Accepts large amounts of yard waste for a small fee. NO plastic rope, bags, or twine; grass clippings, tree stumps, soil or dirt, sod, wood, animal excrement, or noxious weeds including bamboo of any kind. Tree limbs must be less than 12" inches in diameter.

Speed limit within the center is 5 MPH at all times.

# CURBSIDE TRASH

- All trash goes into your green cart with the green lid. Materials outside the cart will not be collected.
- Trash should be bagged before being placed in the cart. Bagging helps keep your cart clean and reduces windblown litter.
- Prohibited items include recyclables (see left), tires, hazardous waste, liquid paint, motor oil, electronics, yard waste, construction debris (wood, concrete, window panes, etc.), dirt, rock, and car parts.
- Overfilled carts or carts containing prohibited items will not be collected.

## UPCOMING SPECIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTIONS

Place curbside on your scheduled collection day, but will be collected that week by a separate vehicle.

#### **BULK ITEM COLLECTION: Week of November 27**

One item per collection. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the trash cart; with the general rule of thumb being an item the approximate dimensions and weight of a standard size sofa, and that can be carried by two (2) men. Acceptable items include plastic dishwashers, furniture, mattresses and box springs (wrapped in plastic), rugs rolled up and tied and no larger than 3' x 6'. Unacceptable items include, but are not limited to, electronics, construction debris (i.e. wood, sinks, toilets, doors, windows, siding, roofing shingles, etc.), large glass items (i.e. glass tables, china cabinets, or window panes), hazardous materials, tires, yard waste, grass clippings, or additional household trash. If you can't wait for a bulk item collection, you may request a special bulk item collection by contacting Waste Management Customer Service at 800.621.2100. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township, PA to receive the Township's \$40 per item pickup price. Be sure to get the confirmation number in the event follow-up is needed.

#### YARD WASTE COLLECTION: November 6

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, garden clippings) will be collected curbside. You must place your yard waste at the curb in one of the following ways or it will NOT be collected -

- Place your yard waste in any clean, open-top container (NOT YOUR AUTOMATED CART).
- Tie your yard waste with cotton or hemp twine in bundles no larger than 3' x 3' x 3', weighing no more than 40 lbs. (NO PLASTIC ROPE OR TWINE).
- Place your yard waste in compostable paper bags (NO PLASTIC BAGS).
- No grass clippings, tree stumps loose soils, sod, wood, or tree limbs over four inches in diameter; human or animal excrement; noxious weeds or soil contaminated with hazardous substances.

#### LEAF COLLECTION: Eight weeks in the Fall (typically mid-October to second week of December)

Residents must rake their leaves into the street and close to the curb. This collection is highly dependent on weather conditions.

#### CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION - First three (3) full weeks in January

Remove any transport bags, tinsel, ornaments, lights, and tree stands.

#### FEES:

- **PENN PUMP:** There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00am–10:00pm
  - 1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit \*Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. **Residents \$100.00**
  - Penn Pump Picnic Permit \*Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people. Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. Residents \$50.00
- **RIVERVIEW**: Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm. **Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00**


#### **Insulated Water Bottles:**

Portable sacks can be attached to your belt or backpack and used as an on-the-go trash can while walking, hiking or camping. Moreover, if you see additional trash or litter while out on the trails or in the park, you can do your part to pick it up and pack it out too.

#### **Battery Operated Lawn tools:**

If it's time to replace your gas powered garden tools, consider a new battery operated lawn tool. Thanks to improved battery technology, batteries are more powerful and last longer. If you have already invested in battery powered home workshop tools; the conversion to battery powered garden tools is that much more justifiable.

#### PALMER TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT



We are excited to announce Palmer Township was awarded grant funding to support new projects along the Bushkill Creek and the 9/11 Trail. In the Fall of 2022 and the winter of 2023 our Board of Supervisors asked the Planning, Parks & Recreation, Public Services and Public Works departments to identify projects most in need of grant funding. Topping the list were projects that could improve the quality of the Bushkill Creek, the use and enjoyment of its parks, and the condition of the Palmer Bikeway/Two Rivers Trail now host to the September 11th National Memorial Trail.



Bushkill Creek is one of our most important creeks because it has a state-wide designation of 'Cold Water Fishes' stream and if cared for properly can host native brook trout. Its watershed is one of the largest of 19 watersheds in Northampton and spans nearly 80 square miles of land and collects rainwater from six boroughs and eight townships. In Palmer, it runs along the eastern border of the township and at times is edged by thin wooded riparian buffers, parks, trails, homes, and some historic mills and factories, one of which is the birthplace of Crayola Crayon. Planning and improvement of the Bushkill Creek corridor and the parks along the creek was identified as a top priority of the 2020 Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan: Tomorrow's Palmer, Sustaining the Legacy.

Our first grant of \$75,000 comes from the Pennsylvania Local Share Account and will help fund the Mill Race Park and 9/11 Master Trail Plan. A volunteer committee, planners, and landscape architects will help residents reimagine the park use and make sure people of all abilities can access the park's amenities and especially the September 11th National Memorial Trail (9/11 Trail). We're proud to host an important segment of the 9/11 Trail and to honor those who perished in that terrible tragedy and who today use the trail from New York City to Central Pennsylvania and Washington to pay tribute.

Our second grant of \$75,000 comes from the Northampton County Livable Landscapes Program and will help fund the Bushkill Creek Greenway, Park, and Trail Master Plan. Another volunteer committee will work with planners, landscape architects, and specialists to study the creek and the entire corridor of open space, natural areas, parks, and trails along the Bushkill Creek from Tatamy Borough down to the Binney & Smith historic birthplace of the Crayola Crayon. When it's complete, the plan will help prioritize improvements throughout the entire Bushkill Creek corridor.

#### **CODES & PERMITS**

#### CLEARANCE OF SNOW FROM PUBLIC SIDEWALKS



Please remember that all snow, ice, or sleet shall be removed from all public sidewalks abutting your property within 12 hours after the snow has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon. This includes the accessibility ramps located at street intersections. Whenever it

may be impossible to remove all snow, sleet, or ice, which may have become compacted by travel or formed on sidewalks so as to present a slippery surface, ashes, cinders, sand or any other suitable substance shall be applied as to facilitate safe walking upon the sidewalks.

Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.

\$109-3(SS) - Depositing snow prohibited: No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner, deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire



hydrant or privately owned property without the permission from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.

#### WHEN IS A PERMIT REQUIRED?

The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code, as well as, the ordinances of Palmer Township require permits for many types of projects. Activities requiring permits include:

Any structural change/alteration

- Plumbing
- Electrical
- Mechanical/HVAC (new and replacement)
- Water heaters (new and replacement)
- Re-roofing
- Decks
- Pools (permanent and temporary)
- Finished basements
- Driveways (replacement, expansion and resurface)
- Signs (except political signs) and banners
- Additional living space conversions
- Patios and patio roofs
- Fences (temporary and permanent)
- Retaining walls
- Sheds and carports (accessory structures)
- Pavilions/Gazebos






