#### IN LOVING MEMORY OF ED DEAN

Palmer Township gathered to honor a man whose life was defined by service, sacrifice, and unwavering dedication—Ed Dean.

His beloved family—his son-in-law Wayne Smith, our Chief of Police; his daughters Stefanie Smith and Valerie Diaz; and his grandson Jacob Allen—stood proudly as they accepted a proclamation recognizing Ed's profound impact on our community. The presentation was made by our Vice Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, Jeffrey Young.

Ed served his country with distinction in the United States Navy during the Korean War, and he continued that spirit of

service right here at home. In 1965, he joined the Palmer Township Fire Company and Suburban Rescue Squad and later became one of the charter members of the Palmer Municipal Fire Department. For 15 years, Ed served as Fire Chief, leading with strength, compassion, and commitment.

Even after retiring from the fire department, Ed's dedication to Palmer didn't end. He continued working as a Code Officer and remained deeply involved in preserving and sharing the history of the township he loved. His legacy can be seen throughout our community—and within the walls of our Municipal Building where his cherished historical collection is proudly displayed.

Ed Dean was a husband, father, grandfather, veteran, firefighter, and friend—but most of all, he was the kind of person who made Palmer Township better just by being in it. His memory will forever burn bright in the heart of our township.

We are grateful for his life and mourn his loss alongside the Dean family and all who were lucky enough to know him.

#### **UPDATE FROM SENATOR LISA BOSCOLA**

As we are in the heat of the summer, if there are any issues with state government that are making you even hotter under the collar, please contact one of my district offices and we will work to resolve your issue. As always, a reminder that my Bethlehem District Office at 1 E. Broad St, Suite 120 is open Monday-Friday from 9 am – 5 pm and my Easton office at 1701 Washington Blvd in Wilson is open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9-5. Please stop on in or if you wish to set up a specific time to come in, please call us at 610-868-8667 (Bethlehem) or 610-250-5627 (Easton). We are always welcoming the opportunity to assist you on state-related matters!



My office can assist with many state related matters as well as other services to save you time and stress. These include FREE Notary Services (CANNOT Notarize Title Work); Unemployment Compensation Assistance, Property Tax/Rent Rebate Form Assistance, PennDOT (Drivers Licenses, Registration, Disability Placards and Plates, etc.) services, Birth and Death Certificate Applications, Annual Dog Licenses, Vote by Mail Applications.

The Property Tax and Rent Rebate program's deadline has been extended to December 31, 2025. My office has applications, and my staff can assist you in completing and submitting them for you. The income limit for both homeowners and renters is now \$45,000 with a maximum rebate of \$1,000. It is important to note when calculating your income for this program, that only half of Social Security benefits, count towards that limit. All other income will be added to that to determine financial eligibility. Pennsylvanians over 65, widows or widowers between the ages of 50-64, or individuals who are permanently disabled between the ages of 18-64 that meet the income eligibility can apply.

As we are getting older inevitably our loved ones want to help us. My offices are full of publications that can help you and your loved ones assist in managing your affairs. One of the most popular free publications in my offices is the "Personal Affairs Record." This book helps your family by giving them immediate access to vital information in times of an emergency. Call my office to have one mailed to you or stop by one of my offices and ask for a copy of this book.

Congratulations to Palmer Township and the Palmer Kiwanis for the completion of the Palmer Township Kiwanis Youth Center, providing youth with a place to come together for recreational, educational, and cultural programs. It will be a tremendous benefit for our community. It will also serve to provide a space for other activities to benefit all residents of Palmer. I was proud to be able to secure over \$200,000 in state grants to make the Palmer Township Kiwanis Youth Center a reality!

#### **New Handheld Device Ban While Driving**

A new Pennsylvania law banning the use of handheld devices while driving is now in effect.

Paul Miller's Law, which started being enforced on June 5, limits the use of handheld cellphones or other communication devices while operating a motor vehicle. The law is named for a young man who was killed in a crash involving a distracted tractor-trailer driver in Monroe County, Pennsylvania, in 2010.

Under the law, driving while holding a mobile device is a primary violation, meaning police can pull over drivers solely for the violation. For the first 12 months, the penalty is a written warning. Effective in June 2026, the penalty is a summary offense, which carries a \$50 fine, plus court costs and other fees. If a driver is convicted of homicide by vehicle and driving while distracted, they may be sentenced up to an additional five years in prison.



Drivers can still use their phones if using hands-free technology, such as a docking station, Bluetooth or speaker technology. You may also use your phone to contact emergency responders.





#### **Back to School Sustainability**

School season is quickly approaching, which means back-to-school shopping is in full swing! While the school-goers in your home may





shopping is in full swing! While the school-goers in your home may need some new supplies, it is important to first take inventory of what is already around the house, as many items can be reused or donated. This includes clothes, notebooks, backpacks, pencils, and various other school essentials. According to a study done in 2024 by the US Senate Federal Credit Union, the average household spends \$875 on back-to-school shopping, roughly \$586 per school-aged child. Many of these expenses can be avoided by reusing/repurposing supplies you may already own. Embracing the mantra "reduce, reuse, recycle" and applying it to your back-to-school routine is a smart way to help the environment and your wallet.

**Reducing** the number of products you purchase results in less pollution and waste in landfills by decreasing the demand for new materials and manufacturing. This in turn, reduces greenhouse gas emissions and helps combat climate change. Instead of buying new backpacks and lunchboxes every year, try cleaning and reusing the ones you already have. This will help you feel better about your environmental impact, reduce your contribution to climate change, and save some money!

Reusing many school supplies and items typically discarded after one year can be reused. This includes products such as binders, scissors, pencil cases, lunch boxes, and backpacks. Instead of buying new notebooks, consider reusing a lightly used one and removing the used pages. If you think you are in need of some newer products because you have reused all of your past ones, shopping second-hand is a cost-effective and sustainable choice. For items you may not be able to find in second hand stores, purchase new supplies made from recycled or sustainable materials, rather than plastic.

These small changes can make a positive difference for both your wallet and the planet.

**Recycling/Donating** is a sustainable way to repurpose supplies you or your child may no longer need, while reducing landfill waste and allowing others an opportunity to purchase supplies at a lower cost. Donating old clothes to drop-off bins around Palmer is a meaningful way to keep products in circulation rather than contributing to waste.

Additionally, recycling old papers from past notebooks and folders is another effective way to further reduce your environmental impact.

While back-to-school season can be stressful for many, reducing costs and making environmentally conscious choices can help alleviate some of that stress. It is also a valuable opportunity to educate your children about the positive impact they can have by choosing more sustainable forms of consumption, helping them understand the environment and the importance of sustainability.





In February, Palmer Township announced the undertaking of the Bushkill Creek Greenway Master Plan. The planning process launched in April, and the project is now well underway. It is a community-driven process that will provide a roadmap for Palmer Township to make impactful, achievable improvements to the Greenway and improve the resiliency of the Bushkill Creek for years to come.

Palmer Township has contracted with Omnes (www.omnes.studio) to lead the plan; they are a local planning and landscape architecture consultant whose studio is located along the Bushkill at the Simon Silk Mill. Their team has worked on similar greenway and waterfront projects, both locally and nationally, and they also recently completed a study for trails on the eastern reach of the Bushkill Greenway in Easton. Their team includes Wildlands Conservancy, ecologists and



biologists who have been performing dam removal and restoration projects along Bushkill Creek for the past 10 years. The planning team also includes AKRF, a civil engineering firm that specializes in sustainable stormwater and waterfront resiliency.

The Omnes team analyzed the greenway and presented their in-depth findings at a public meeting in May. An initial community survey was completed in June to help inform the direction of the master plan's recommendations. The results of that survey are available on the Township's website.

The planning recommendations will include solutions to mitigate flooding, update park facilities, demonstrate exemplary accessibility, and support trail system changes. The team will also develop concept plans for parks along the greenway that enhance the multi-use recreation experience and find ways to celebrate local history & culture along the Creek. The plan will also explore the potential future of the dam at Penn Pump Park, with free funding available via the Delaware River Basin Commission mitigation fund.

The Bushkill Creek Greenway is made up of the following parks and trails that run along the Bushkill Creek in Palmer Township: the Palmer Bikeway; Mill Race Park; Penn's Grant Open Space along the Schoeneck Creek Trail (Penn's Grant Path); Penn Pump Park; Binney & Smith Preserve; and the natural area below Bushkill Park called Hillcrest Open Space. The plan also includes Keystone Park, since there is some recreational overlap with Mill Race Park, especially for PTAA sporting events. The plan includes consideration for a private parcel below Stocker Mill Road called Two Fool's Island, which is privately owned now, but could be acquired in the future, should grants become available.

The master plan is helping the Township to solve challenges along the Creek with multi-dimensional solutions that consider both management and safety issues, while providing ecological benefit. Moreover, the plan will enhance the peace and beauty of the Creek, with fun recreational moments that serve resident's needs. The final result of the process will be a phased improvement plan with short term (1-3 year), mid-term (3-5 year), and long term (5-10 year) initiatives for improving the greenway. The planning team will also develop cost estimates and a list of potential grant resources that could help fund the plan recommendations.

There are many ways to get involved as the project progresses. Omnes and the Township will be in attendance at Palmer Community Weekend to discuss the plan's concepts and ideas, so everyone in the community will have the opportunity to inform the final plan. There will also be a public presentation later in August when the team will present concepts and planning recommendations. The project's last presentation will take place in October, with the final plan being delivered to the Township at the end of the year.

#### The Economic Value of Trails

Did you know that trails aren't just great for health and recreation—they also boost home values? Numerous studies, including those conducted in Pennsylvania, have found that proximity to outdoor recreation trails can significantly increase property values. A widely cited economic impact study on Pennsylvania's Three Rivers Heritage Trail and other trails found that for every foot closer a home is to a trail, the property value can increase by up to \$9 per linear foot.

In communities across the state, homeowners consistently report higher resale values and quality of life when located near well-maintained multi-use trails. Whether it's a wooded path or a paved rail-trail, the data is clear: trails are an investment that pays off—not just in health, but in real dollars.

Palmer Township is making significant progress in the planning and improvement of our 12 miles of trails and the promotion of our great neighborhoods, businesses and restaurants that benefit from having the Palmer Bikeway Trail and the September 11th National Memorial Trail in our community.

It is the Parks & Recreation Department's goal to provide citizens with a safe environment in which recreational opportunity can be maximized. Due to the wide variety of patron needs and use of Township property, it is necessary to establish the following rules and regulations.

#### Event representative must have permit with them for duration of the event.

**RESERVATIONS:** Will be available to Palmer residents only for the month of January, beginning on January 2nd, 2025 at 9:00am. Park rentals will become available to the general public on February 3rd, 2025 at 9:00am. All reservations must be completed in person at the Charles Chrin Community Center of Palmer Township, located at 4100 Green Pond Road Palmer, PA 18045, Phone: 610-252-2098 \*Pavilion rentals are prohibited during Palmer Community Weekend.

#### **FEES:**

- **PENN PUMP:** There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm
  - 1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit \*Not to exceed 150 people.
    Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access.
    Residents \$100.00
  - **2.** Penn Pump Picnic Permit \*Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people.

Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. **Residents \$50.00** 

- RIVERVIEW: Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm. Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- BIP PAVILION, BRIARCLIFFE, FAIRVIEW, KEYSTONE,
   & MILL RACE Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm. Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00
